### **PUBLICATIONS**

St. Helena's first ever State of the Environment Report was published in June 2013.

#### **PROJECTS**

In July members of EMD, SHNT & Basil Read planted up to 400 plants as part of the re-development of the Horse Point Landfill Site.

The 1st November, saw the start of another project as SHG signed a contract with Basil Read for the redevelopment of the Horse Point Landfill Site.

#### **CONSERVATION MILESTONE ACHIEVED**

A conservation milestone was passed on the 21<sup>st</sup> November 2013. The Terrestrial Conservation Section recorded its 1,000<sup>th</sup> collection since the inception of St Helena's endemic seed bank.

#### LAUNCH OF THE PEAKS NATIONAL PARK

The Peaks National Park was successfully launched on World Tourism Day, 27<sup>th</sup> September.

Marine Awareness Week was held on St Helena from 22<sup>nd</sup> February – 1<sup>st</sup> March 2013.

Environment Week was held on St Helena from 3rd – 8th June 2013.

EMD held its first Stakeholder Engagement Forum on 18th April, at Jamestown Community Centre.

A Recycling Forum was held on Wednesday, 27th November 2013.

#### **CONFERENCES/WORKSHOPS**

St Helena was represented at the Monitoring Protected Areas workshop that was held on Ascension in June.

**'St Helena Science'** was held on Wednesday, 14th August at the newly opened Business and Information Centre at The Canister, in Jamestown.

St Helena was represented by Marine Conservation Officer, Elizabeth Clingham; who presented at the International Whale Shark conference, in October.

St Helena was represented by Darwin Project Manager, Judith Brown at the Marine Protected Areas workshop for the UK Overseas Territories.

#### **FUNDING**

A grant was secured from JNCC for a research project to develop propagation techniques for rare, threatened endemic Ferns on St Helena in July 2013.



St Helena Islands' Environment enthusiasts' were extremely pleased when it was announced earlier this month that five of St Helena's bids were successfully funded by the Overseas Territories Environment and Climate Fund (Darwin Plus). A total amount of £297,217 was awarded to the island for the following:

- Conservation of the Spiky Yellow Woodlouse and Black Cabbage Tree Woodland (£37,090)
- Darwin Fellowship MRes Carbon Sequestration in Community Forests (£21,617)
- Securing St Helena's Rare Cloud Forest Trees and Associated Invertebrates (£98,380)
- St Helena Baseline Assessment: A foundation for effective Environmental Management (£96,700)
- Taxonomic and Conservation Status of Oceanodroma Storm Petrels in the South Atlantic (£43,430)

#### ST HELENA BIRD RINGING SCHEME



The St Helena Ringing Scheme has had a very busy year. The marine team with help from local volunteers has managed to process, that is ring and measure over 2476 birds. This includes 288 brown noddies, 1574 Madeiranstorm petrels, 360 masked boobies and 245 red-billed tropicbirds. There have also been a few surprises along the way such as white faced storm petrels, a Bulwer's petrel and a black noddy. Let's hope next year is just as productive!

#### NATIVE AND ENDEMIC PLANT COLLECTION, PROPAGATION AND DISTRIBUTION POLICY

The Environmental Management Division (EMD) currently has the 'Native and endemic plant collection, propagation and distribution policy' out for public consultation.

The policy has been devised after comprehensive consultation with key stakeholders. It aims to provide **clear guidance and an enabling framework** for those wishing to collect endemic or native seed, and propagate and distribute endemic and native species for restoration or commercial purposes. The policy also provides the **licensing system** for these activities as required under Section 20, Subsections 1 & 2 of the (draft) Environmental Protection Ordinance.

As part of this consultation, two public meetings are scheduled:

- 6<sup>th</sup> January 2014 at the Longwood Community Centre from 7.30pm 8.30pm
- 8<sup>th</sup> January 2014 at the Kingshurst Community Centre from 7.30pm 8.30pm

These meetings are an opportunity for interested persons to come and learn more, ask questions and provide feedback about this policy.

The public consultation phase ends on 17 January 2014. Any feedback submitted by then will be used to revise the policy, which will then be presented to the Environment & Natural Resources Committee for their final endorsement.

#### **CLOSED SEASON FOR SPEAR FISHING**

The Closed Season for Spear Fishing is

#### 1ST OF JANUARY 2013 TO 31ST OF MARCH 2013

SPEAR FISHING IS NOT ALLOWED AT ANY TIME
OR PLACE IN ST HELENA'S WATERS DURING THIS PERIOD.

The Spear Guns (Control) Ordinance CAP 91 states that during the closed season, no person shall have a spear gun in his possession on or within twenty metres of any tidal water or upon any beach or foreshore or whilst swimming or whilst in any vessel.

The aim of the closed season is not to stop people from enjoying the sea, it is to respect our oceans and it's resources; During this period most fish are at the spawning stage and it is therefore necessary to put measures in place to allow marine life a chance to breed and to grow into sustainable resources.

### **FLYTIPPING IN THE RUN IN JAMESTOWN**

A REMINDER to the public that it is an offence to dump any kind of waste (including organic waste) in the Jamestown Run. Discarding of waste in the Jamestown run is <a href="ILLEGAL">ILLEGAL</a> and offenders risk prosecution which could result in a fine of up to £10,000 if convicted.
