Honourable Members, ladies and gentlemen, welcome to this first sitting of the seventh meeting of the Legislative Council. A special welcome back to the Honourable Lawson Henry, who has recently returned from a Joint Ministerial Conference in London where important representations were made on behalf of the island.

The purpose of this meeting today, as Honourable Members will know, is to elect a Chairperson for the Public Health Committee as well as a member to serve on the Executive Council. This has become necessary as a result of the resignation from Legislative Council of former Councillor, Ian Rummery, earlier this month. Honourable Members and the public have already been informed by Mr Rummery himself of his reasons for his resignation from this Council, namely, to fill a post that has been approved that has for some time become vacant in the Public Health Department where he believes he can best assist the community. Mr Rummery, during his term of office on Council, has been extremely supportive of the policies of this Council and has been visually active in the Committees on which he served during that period, namely Executive Council, the Public Health Committee and the Social and Community Development Committee in addition to this Council. I know that Honourable Members will want me to wish Ian well in his new role in the Public Health Department and I am happy to do so.

Honourable Members will, I know, fully appreciate the importance of filling vacancies that exist at the earliest possible time so that the important work of the Council Committees and, indeed, the Executive Council, can continue with minimal disruption and I thank everyone

for your agreement that this short meeting today is to be devoted specifically for this purpose. Equally, I am convinced that the electorate appreciates how important it is to fill the vacancy that now exists in the Legislative Council and will, no doubt, be preparing for the by election to be held in March this year. Honourable Members are fully aware of the election process so I believe there will be little need for intervention by the Speaker. However, for the purpose of public information I will explain that the nomination and election of members are entirely in the hands of the elected members of this Council. Our valued ex officio members can neither nominate nor vote; that is a Constitutional requirement.

May I say thank you to all who have worked behind the scenes to prepare for this meeting, Mrs Carol George for taking on the role once more of the Clerk in the absence of the substantive Clerk and SAMS Radio for their valuable support to this Council.

I shall now ask the Clerk to call the next item of business.

#### **4. ELECTIONS**

##### **1. Election of Chairman of the Public Health Committee.**
