







Pantropical Spotted Dolphin (Stenella attenuate)

SIZE: Male: 2.60 m Female: 2.40 m Calf: 0.80 - 0.85 m



COLOUR: White tipped beak, variable degree of spotting, light grey swath sweeping upward.

DISTINCTIVE FEATURES: Very active and agile often breach and bow rides.

WHEN YOU MIGHT SEE THEM: All year round, the most abundant dolphin species around St Helena usually found in large pods.

Bottlenose Dolphin (Tursiops truncatus)

SIZE: Male: 3.80 m Female: 3.70 m Calf: 1.10 - 1.30 m



COLOUR: Dark grey upper body with light grey underneath.

DISTINCTIVE FEATURES: A robust head with a short and stubby bottle shaped beak. Often numerous scars on body. They are also less agile than Pantropical spotted dolphins.

WHEN YOU MIGHT SEE THEM: All year round usually seen with Rough-toothed dolphins and less common than Pantropical spotted dolphins. Highly social, often breach and bow-rides.

Rough-toothed Dolphin (Stena bredanensis)

SIZE: Male: 2.80 m Female: 2.65 m Calf: 1.00 m



COLOUR: White lips and throat. Irregular spotting and yellowish white or pinkish white blotching on its body.

DISTINCTIVE FEATURES: Long beak with a distinctive smoothly sloping forehead.

WHEN YOU MIGHT SEE THEM: Usually found in small pods of 10-40 often amongst Bottlenose dolphins.
