3. Background Information	The Welfare of Children Ordinance deals with the requirements that Children's Home that are run privately must comply with.  There are no specific provisions for Children's Homes run by the Government.					
4. Evidence	It is necessary to state clearly the standard that the					

Children's Residential Home run by the Safeguarding Directorate should meet. This is because the children that live there have been entrusted to the Care of the Government and so the lack of regulations is a gap.

#### 5. Details of Proposal (attach further pages if necessary)

The draft Regulations were drafted by SW Ursula Smith and Crown Counsel Laura McMullan before they both finished their contracts.

The Regulations deal with various aspects of the operation of the Children's Residential Home — from admission of a child, to the standard of accommodation, food, discipline, etc. Please refer to the Draft Regulations and the Explanatory Notes attached.

# 6. What will happen if no legislation is made

If the Regulations are not approved, then there will be no clear standards by which the Children's Residential Home should be run. This would not comply with the recommendations of the Wass Report.

#### 7. Impact of the proposed legislation

The impact on the Children's Residential Home is substantial as the Manager will need to put the processes and policies in place to ensure that the Children's Residential Home is fully compliant. There is no impact to other directorates.

## 8. Proposed timescales

The Regulations are ready to be considered and approved by ExCo. We ask that they are considered by the next SCDC meeting so that they may go to ExCo in October 2017.
