AN ORDINANCE

to amend the Liquor Ordinance, 1988, to further regulate occasional liquor licences.

Enacted by the Governor of St Helena with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council of St Helena.

Citation

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Liquor (Amendment) Ordinance, 2018.

Occasional liquor licences

2. Section 8 of the Liquor Ordinance, 1988, is amended by repealing subsection (1) and substituting the following:

“(1) Subject to this Ordinance, the court may, on the occasion of any entertainment or other special occasion, grant to any person an occasional liquor licence for one or more such occasions, subject to the following conditions:

- (a) the location and other arrangements for the sale or consumption of alcohol for such occasions are all identical; and
- (b) the licence is valid for a maximum of 26 specified occasions covering no more than 2 days in any 7 day period.”.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Ordinance)

This Ordinance amends the Liquor Ordinance, 1988, to make provision for a single application for an occasional liquor licence for more than one entertainment or special occasion. These licences will be granted only if the location and other arrangements for the sale and consumption of alcohol are identical and the licence will be valid for no more than 26 specified occasions covering a maximum of 2 days in any 7 day period.
