




A Child Of the Dales by Diane Allen




A Scottish Island Summer by Julie Shackman







Deadline by Sandra Brown






The Uninvited by Jonathan Daniel

But something ravenous and incomprehensible refuses to let them off the island alive.




We Solve Murders by Richard Osman



As a breakneck race around the world begins, can they stay one step ahead of a deadly enemy?






Montana Bound by Greg Mitchell






Daydream by Hannah Grace

Addy's about to leave Bay View behind and take a leap into the unknown and Phoebe's tired of keeping secrets. Everybody's ready to move on.






Lift the Flap Transport Atlas by Christina Webb

Marla isn't who she thinks she is.


I am a girl trying to forget.

And so Toffee is who she becomes.


But as her bond with Marla grows, Allison begins to ask herself: Where is home? What is a family? And, most importantly, Who am I, really?
