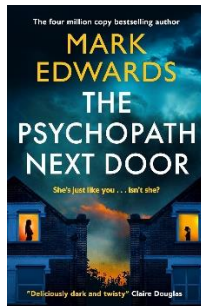

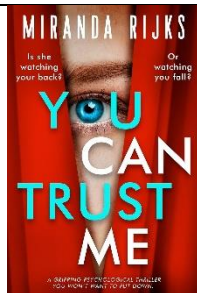


The Psychopath Next Door by Mark Edwards

A mysterious event

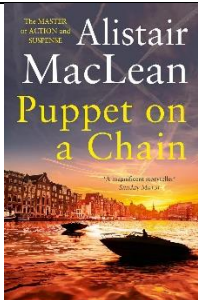
An all-American diner appears overnight in a remote British field. More and more objects materialise: toys, fairground rides, pets and other treasured mementos of the past.

A fight for the future

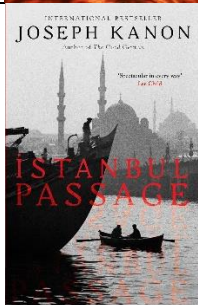

Puppet On A Chain by Alistair Maclean

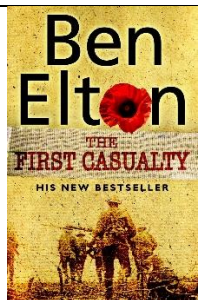
Paul Sherman of Interpol's Narcotics Bureau flies to Amsterdam on the trail of a dope king.

Leon's attempt to save one life leads to a desperate manhunt and a maze of shifting loyalties that threatens his own. Flanders, June 1917: a British officer and celebrated poet, is shot dead.

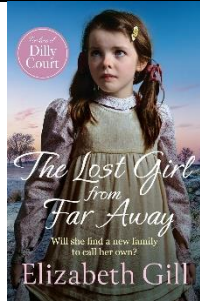
He is killed not by German fire, but while recuperating from shell shock well behind the lines.

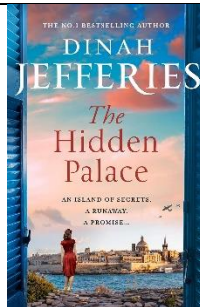


The Lost Girl From Far Away by Elizabeth Gill

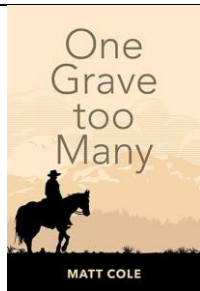
A sister with a secret

A rift over generations

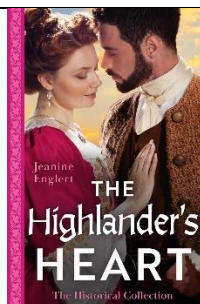
Betrayals and secrets, lies and silence hang between the sisters.

One Grave Too Many by Matt Cole





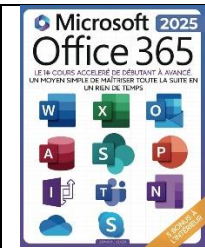


The Highlander's Heart by Jeanine Engler

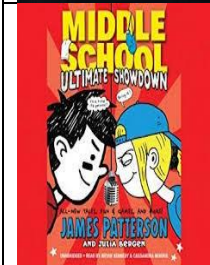
Once Upon A Dream by Liz Braswell

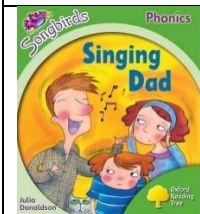

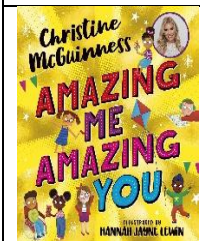

Amazing Me Amazing You by Christine McGuinness

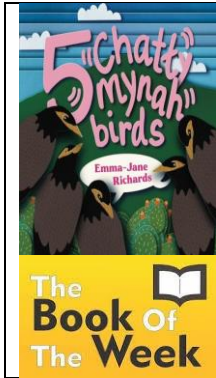
The perfect picture book celebrating all children with a message of kindness and friendship.
