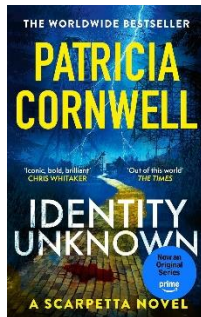

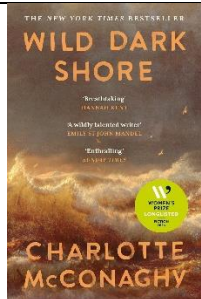


Identity Unknown by Patricia Cornwell

A family on a remote island. A mysterious woman washed ashore. A storm gathering force.

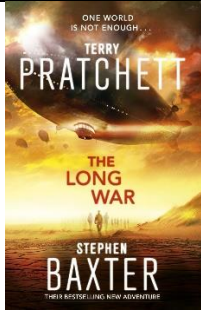

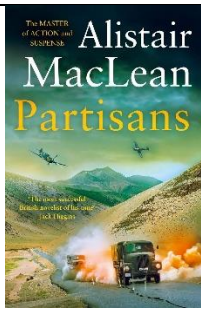
The Long War by Terry Pratchett

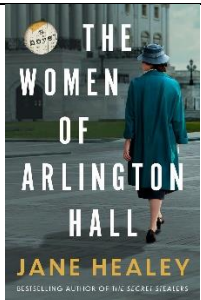
The Mist by Ragnar Jonasson







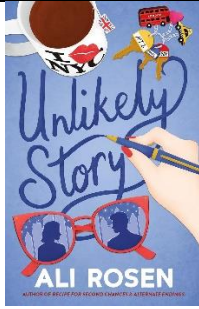
The Women of Arlington Hall by Jane Healey

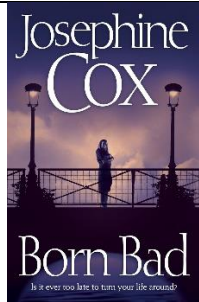
Unlikely Story by Ali Rosen

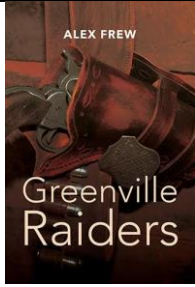
TEN FRIGHTENED CHILDREN.

With time and air running out, can they team up to outsmart their captors? Or are they doomed to an unthinkable fate?





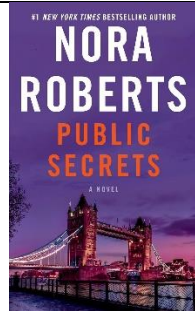
Greenville Raiders by Alex Frew

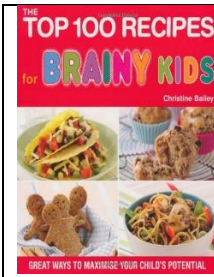
Public Secrets by Nora Roberts

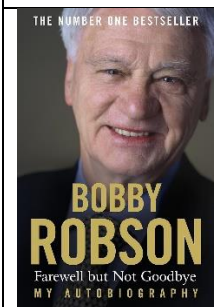
The Top 100 Recipes for Brainy Kids by Christine Bailey

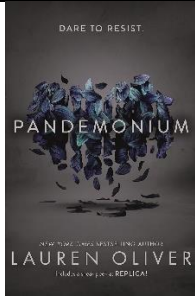
Classic 1000 Cocktail Recipes by Robert Cross

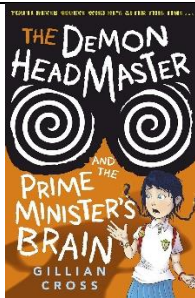
Pandemonium by Lauren Oliver

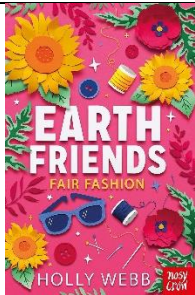

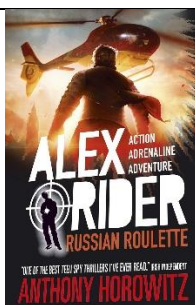
Demon Headmaster books still hold readers under their hypnotic spell. Fast-paced and full of adventure, they're impossible to resist!
