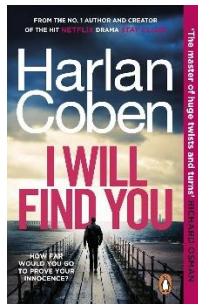

I Will Find You by Harlan Coben

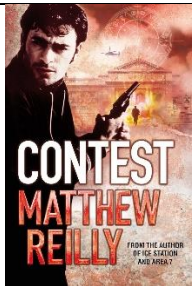

David plans a harrowing escape from prison, determined to do what seems impossible, save his son, clear his own name, and discover the real story of what happened that devastating night.

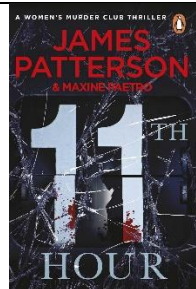


Contest by Matthew Reilly

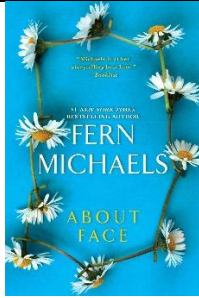
A wolf in sheep's clothing

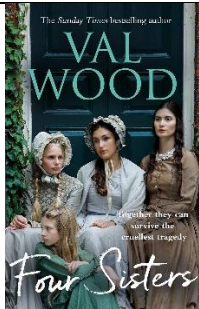
About Face by Fern Michaels

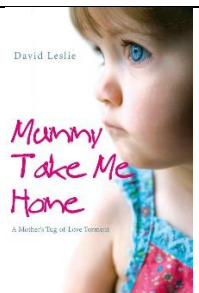
Fools' Frontier by E. Jefferson Clay



Four Sisters by Val Wood

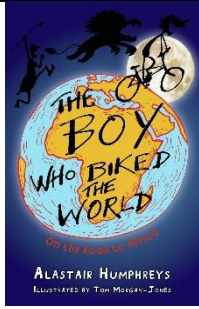

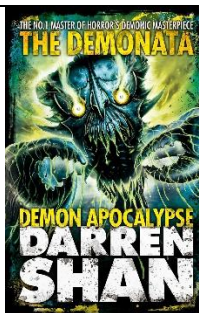
The Boy Who Biked The World by Alastair Humphreys

Demon Apocalypse by Darren Shan

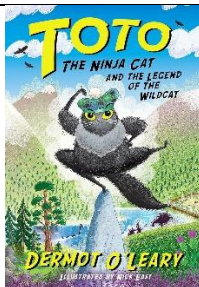

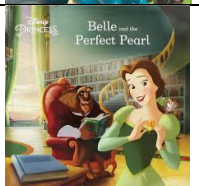
