SUBJECT Proposed Amendments to Enterprise St Helena (ESH) Ordinance

Memorandum by the Chief Executive for Economic Development (CEED)

- **ADVICE SOUGHT** The Economic Development Committee (EDC) is asked to consider the changes proposed by Enterprise St Helena (ESH) to its Ordinance and authorise such for submission to Governor in Council for progression through law making system.
- **BACKGROUND & Following the endorsement of the Sustainable Economic Development Plan 2012/13 – 2021/22, Enterprise St Helena was** established in July 2012 in the place of its predecessor the St Helena Development Agency (SHDA). The amendments that were made to the SHDA Ordinance at that time were mainly in respect of a change of name from SHDA to ESH, in that all references to SHDA were repealed and replaced with ESH, and to reflect the function of ESH, as such to promote and facilitate economic development. The then review also made provisions for the transitions to vest all assents and liablities of SHDA to ESH.

Over the years, the remit of ESH has evolved beyond its predecessor's remit and its services and support mechanisms to enable the economic development. Also, ESH recognises that good corporate goverance is fundamental to the effective management of the organisation and is currently strengthening its goverance arrangements across the whole of the organisation, aligned with best practice and compliance with regulatory requirements.

The ESH Ordinance sets out the arrangements, powers and legal standing for the establishment of the organisation, which reflects on structure, rules, policies and procedures that govern how the organisation operates, hence ESH seeks to strengthen the provisions of the Ordinance so that all internal policies and procedures made under this law is aligned across ESH.

The ESH Board and its Finance Goverance and Audit Subcommittee have been consulted, and the Attorney Generals Chambers have provided advice on the draft amendments with a likely legal implication.

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Please find attached the ESH Ordinance with track changes on which we have been liaising with the Attorney Generals Chambers and have prepared a form of formal wording for the proposed amendments.
