he MV Artania arrived in James Bay on Tuesday 1 November 2016 at around 7.45am, with 946 passengers and 516 crew on-board.

Again, a local market was set up in Jamestown and in Longwood. The MV Artania will have an overnight stay, leaving tomorrow, Wednesday 2 November 2016.

MV Artania is a cruise ship chartered since 2011 by Phoenix Reisen, a German-based travel agency and cruise ship operator. She was built for Princess Cruises by Wärtsilä at the Helsinki Shipyard, Finland, and launched on 18 February 1984. V Europa anchored in James Bay on Thursday 27 October 2016, around 8am, with 336 passengers and 283 crew on-board.

A local market was set up at the seafront in Jamestown and also on Longwood Green.

The Cruise Ship, owned and operated by German company Hapag-Lloyd, and is the fourth ship to be named *Europa* in the company's history.

For twelve years in a row, the MS Europa was awarded the title 'Best Cruise Ship in the World' by Ward-Ranking and Berlitz. The previous *Europa* is currently sailing as the Saga Sapphire for Saga Cruises.
