# Higher Education

SHCC provides a wealth of opportunities for higher education ranging from A Level Studies to Access Diplomas and Undergraduate degrees. Courses are subsidised for local candidates in accordance with the SHCC Charging Policy. In addition, a limited number of 'funded places' may be available to eligible candidates. ## University Qualifications

The St Helena Community College does not award degrees. Instead, we support students to access **higher education qualifications** through supported Distance Learning with UK Universities.

**Honours Degrees** are also known as undergraduate degrees or first degrees (BA/BSc). **Higher Education Certificates and Diplomas** are recognised as qualifications in their own right; however, they also form the first part of the undergraduate degree and allow learners to progress on to gain degree qualifications. SHCC encourages learners to take this route to gain degree qualifications.
