Sir,

I have the honor to submit to your Excellency the returns of the Census of the population of this Island, taken on the 3rd of April 1881, in obedience to the provisons of Ordinance No. 1, of 1881.

Twenty-four enumerators were employed in securing the returns of families on the day appointed, and after examination of the Schedules, I have every reason to believe that the duty has been carefully and accurately performed.

this is a decrease of 1327, as compared with 1871. This decrease is caused by a large emigration which took place in 1871, 1872, and 1873, consequent on the change and reductions which followed on the opening of the Suez Canal. Emigrant vessels were despatched to this Island from the Cape and Natal, inviting emigrants and offering good employment in those Colonies to any who were disposed to avail themselves of it. The result at that time was that 638 proceeded to the Cape of Good Hope, 441 to Natal, and 261 Liberated Africans were removed to Lagos and Sierra Leone.

The returns of the Census show that since that date the number of the population has remained stationary. A few persons have annually left the Island to join their friends

who had preceded them to the Cape and Natal but the excess of Births over Deaths has made up the loss.

The returns in the former Census distinguish the children of Liberated Africans born in St. Helena, but owing to the mixture with the other portion of the coloured population it is now difficult and almost impossible to make this distinction with accuracy, and the present returns therefore distinguish only those Africans who are Natives of the West Coast of Africa.

The return of Criminal Offences shows that there was not a single conviction in the last year of any Inhabitant for an Indictable Offence, and that no Inhabitant was in Gaol for any offence on the night of the Census. The only prisoners on that occasion being six Seamen for refusal of duty.

In taking the Census, the Enumerators were requested to use that opportunity of obtaining a return of the Live Stock in the Island, which is included in the printed enclosures.
