Your Excellency,

I have the honour of submitting my Report on the Censuses of this Island and Ascension which were taken on the night of April 26th.

I desire to point out to Your Excellency that the figures in the accompanying tables are abstracted from the information supplied in ans-

wer to the questions on the schedule only.

This is the first occasion on which a Census of Ascension has been taken and, therefore, the details, as compared with those of St. Helena, would appear to be incomplete. I have, however, endeavoured to make them as complete as possible.

(1) After the 20 persons named on the attached list had accepted the invitation of the Hon'ble Govt. Secretary to act as Enumerators they were

invitation of the Hon'ble Govt. Secretary to act as Enumerators they were requested to attend a meeting at the Castle on April 18th to discuss and thereby make themselves familiar with the details of the Census Schedule.

All the Enumerators, Mr. Cullen, and myself attended the meeting.

At the end of the meeting the Schedules were distributed to the Enumerators in order that they might have ample time in which to deliver them and, also, that the recipients might have good time in which to study them.

(2) The completed Schedules finally reached me on the evening of May 4th and in this connection I may mention that the Enumerators, in order to assure as much accuracy as possible, were themselves obliged to fill in a large proportion of the Schedules. Generally they did their work satisfactorily.

(3) There was no Shipping in the Port on the night of the Census.

(4) Regarding Table 5, 872 Schedules were actually issued 851 of which may be taken as a fair estimate of the number of "Occupied" houses. The Census Schedule, however, calls for no return of 'Unoccupied' houses. The number under the latter heading may reasonably be taken as negligible. Under a dozen suitable for occupation by Europeans would be a fair estimate,

(5) The return of Live Stock (Table II) whilst not entirely inaccurate

must necessarily be regarded as being only approximate.

The psychological outlook of many of the small Live Stock owners is that a true return would make them appear too affluent and possibly be

the means of the levying of a tax.

(6) Regarding Table 5, I would respectfully submit that if figures may be taken as an indication there would appear to be some improvement in the housing conditions inasmuch that there are fewer people living in houses of one room and upwards since the 1921 Census. A close scrutiny of the individual schedules, however, somewhat contradicts the foregoing evid ence and indicates overcrowding.

The acreage of land returned as being in the possession of Householders amounts to 6892 acres made up as follows:—

These figures indicate a decrease of 329 acres over the 1921 Census. As, however, many of the Smallholders failed to give this information the above figures may be regarded as being approximate.

ed me.
