Your Excellency,

Re Census, 1946.

I have the honour to submit herewith my Report on the Census of this Island which was taken on the night of 27th October, 1946.

- 2. It is regretted that I was unable to call a meeting of the Enumerators before setting out on this task, as I was only informed of my appointment as supervisor six days before the actual day appointed for the taking of the Census.
- 3. However, as soon as I obtained the Schedules, I delivered them personally to the Enumerators with full instructions on how to carry on, and I now feel certain that all persons who should have received the schedules did so, and that all were returned. The figures in the accompanying tables are abstracted from the information supplied on the schedules only.
- 4. This must be the first time for many years that no Garrison has been included in the Census.
- 5. The oldest person in the Island is a Mr. Daniel Crowie who states his age is 91 years, and who has a wife aged 86 years. This couple live at Creeper Hill in the Longwood District. The oldest female is one Agnes Peters who states her age is 90 years. She resides in Jamestown.
- 6. It will be noted in Table II that the increase in the population since the last Census is only 753, and it is also found from records that 651 more persons emigrated than immigrated during the same period, and many of these should now be at Ascension.
- 7. It will also be noted in Table V that the figures relating to housing accommodation (although the population has increased by 753 since 1931, and taking into consideration that a good number of cottages containing three living rooms have been built), show an increase in the number of persons living in 1 room by 206, in 2 rooms by 496, in 3 rooms by 485, but show a decrease of persons living in 4 rooms by 270, and of 5 rooms and over by 238.
- 8. In Tables IX and X children between the ages of 5 years and 15 years (assumed to be school years) are shown separately. The figures show males 555 and females 618, totalling 1,173 children.
- 9. In conclusion I wish to thank the Enumerators, although only having a very short time in which to deliver the Schedules, and in a lot of cases having to fill them in themselves, they were all returned in a very short time, which enabled me to get to work on abstracting the attached information.
