Your Excellency,

I have the honour to submit herewith my report on the Census of the inhabitants of this Island that was taken on the night of 21st October, 1956.

- 2. The enumeration district demarcation lines are identical with those set out in the District Division Order, 1956, with a further sub-division for Half Tree Hollow.
- 3. The census results are to some extent affected by the fact that 181 men were temporarily engaged in Ascension Island in connection with the United States Guided Missile project. If these men had been included in the census returns, the total population of St. Helena would have been 4823 (instead of 4642), comparing with a total of 4748 in 1946.
- 4. In comparison with the 1946 Census Report, the more detailed schedules completed this time have made it possible to include in the present Report much fuller particulars of housing conditions, and of occupational status, while the separate showing of non-gainful employment is felt to have advantages.
- 5. Susan MacDonald, aged 92 years, of Market Street, Jamestown is the oldest female on the Island whilst Charles E. Thomas, aged 90 years, of Knollcomb's is the oldest male.
- 6. I should like to express my grateful thanks to the Enumerators who had to assist a large number of householders to complete their schedules, and to the Tabulators who carried out their onerous task cheerfully and efficiently.
