Your Excellency,

I have the honour to submit herewith my report on the Census of the inhabitants of St. Helena and the St. Helenian inhabitants of Ascension Island which was taken on the night of Sunday, July 24th, 1966.

2. The enumeration districts were identical with the electoral areas as laid down in Statutory Rules and Orders 1963, No. 6.

3. I beg to draw your attention to the following facts which arise from the Report. The total population of St. Helena Island was found to be 4649, made up of 2233 males and 2416 females. Of these inhabitants 75 males and 69 females may be regarded as other than St. Helenian. The population of Ascension Island was found to include 476 St. Helenians, made up of 428 males and 48 females. The number of St. Helenians in the Colony on the night of the Census can be taken, therefore, as 4981, made up of 2586 males and 2395 females.

4. On the night of the Census Eva Buckley, aged 93, of Blue Hill and Eden George Coleman, aged 92, of Levelwood, were the two oldest persons on the Island.

5. I have written to thank the enumerators, tabulators and others without whose willing assistance the Report which follows could not have been compiled.

Analysis of the 1966 Census of St. Helena

GENERAL

1. In some respects direct comparison with the Census of 1956 is impossible since the Census of 1966 was taken by electoral districts as laid down only in 1963.
2. A separate census was taken of St. Helenians on Ascension Island.
3. Only minor changes were made in the forms of schedules used in 1956 and these changes were largely to simplify the householders' task.
4. Landholders were required to complete a new Third Schedule.

POPULATION

5. The total population of St. Helena Island was 4,649 made up of 2,233 males (48% of the total) and 2,416 females (52% of the total), while the St. Helenian population at Ascension totalled 476—428 males and 48 females, 90% and 10% respectively, of the total. The total for both islands was, therefore, 5,125. For comparison with the last census taken in 1956, the total population of St. Helena Island was then 4,642 comprising 2,224 males (48% of the total) and 2,418 females (52% of the total). The total in Ascension in 1956 was 390 made up of 338 males (87% of the total) and 52 females (13% of the total), and the total for both islands was 5,032.

6. Density of population was 98.9 persons to the square mile.

7. 1594 persons were married, 259 were widowed, 855 were single aged 16 and over, 17 were divorced and 1944 were single aged under 16.

8. 42% of persons were aged under 16. Persons of school age numbered 1208 (26% of total population). Of the male population 282 (12.6%) were aged 60 and over and 176 (7.9%) were aged 65 and over. Of the female population 310 (12.8%) were aged 60 and over and 211 (8.7%) were aged 65 and over. Of the total population 592 (12.7%) were aged 60 and over and 387 (8.3%) were aged 65 and over.

POPULATION DISTRIBUTION

9. The population was distributed as follows:—

NATIONALITY AND BIRTHPLACE

10. Only 22 persons were not British born and of these only 10 had not become British by marriage or naturalised British.

11. 184 persons (4%) included in the Census had been born elsewhere than on St. Helena. This compared with 107 such in 1956.

LITERACY, SICKNESS AND INFIRMITY

12. 67 persons aged 16 and over were recorded as unable to read or write. These comprised 2.5% of this section of the population. The comparative percentage for 1956 was 4.5.

13. 93 persons were recorded as sick or infirm of whom 66 were at home and 27 in institutions.

RELIGION

14. 4182 persons, 90% of the population, gave their religion as Church of England. These and the numbers returned as Baptist (139) and Salvationist (122) changed little from those of 1956. Jehovah's Witnesses increased by 50%, from 62 in 1956 to 92 in 1966. Seventh Day Adventists decreased by approximately 25% from 88 to 65. Roman Catholics increased from 12 to 19. 30 persons gave other or no denominations.

OCCUPATIONS

15. 1562 persons (33.6% of the population) were gainfully employed. Interesting and significant changes were as follows:—

A minor influence on apparent changes could be due to variation in interpretation of returns as between 1956 and 1966. Obviously many ex-flaxmill workers called themselves labourers or relief workers. In 1956, however, 130 men were relief workers and 105 on Ascension had been on relief, totalling 235 as compared to 111 on relief work in 1966, although some might have entered themselves as labourers, in 1966, when really relief workers.

60 males and 89 females were entered as unemployed.

HOUSING ACCOMODATION

16. The number of households, 1966, showed an increase of 68, approximately 6.8%, on the 1956 figure.

17. There were 1016 residential buildings of which 1011 were dwelling houses. Of the dwelling houses 12 had only one living room, 472 had 3 or less and 930 had 5 or less. 0.5% of the population lived in one-roomed houses. 65% of the population lived in houses with 3 to 4 living rooms, which compared with 65% living in 2 or 3 roomed houses in 1956. The average persons per room for 3-4 roomed houses in 1966 was 1.3 and for all houses 1.21 compared to 1.29 in 1956.

WATER SUPPLY AND SANITATION

18. 446 residential buildings received a piped water supply, (1956: 424), 288 had a standpipe nearby, (1956: 319), 133 had a tank. It is supposed that houses with tanks generally had other supplies available, if distant, since in 1956 only 64 buildings used a "rain-water tank". 149 residential buildings were near water supplied by springs.

19. 390 residential buildings had water closets, 624 earth closets and 2, apparently, had no sanitary arrangements.

CARDENS

20. 283 residential buildings had a kitchen garden (315 in 1956), 101 had a food garden (152 in 1956) and 632 had no garden (531 in 1956).

HEADS OF HOUSEHOLD

21. 471 heads of household were owner occupiers, 520 rent-paying tenants and 175 free tenants.

22. 341 heads of household had resided outside St. Helena Island, including on Ascension, 55 had visited elsewhere for less than one year, 670 had done neither.

LAND HOLDINGS

23. NOTE: Land held by (i) the Crown (ii) Messrs. W. A. Thorpe and Sons and (iii) Messrs. Solomon and Co. (St. Helena) Ltd. was not included in the return.

24. 241 persons held freehold land, 268 persons held leasehold land and 31 held both free and leasehold land. Total freeholdings was 1432 acres and leaseholdings 369 acres.

25. Total landholders was 540 of whom 406 held less than 2 acres each and 5 held over 50 acres each.
26. 206 acres were cultivated, 355 were under flax, 512 were used for grazing and 728 were bush etc. The cultivated land was held among 441 persons of whom 283 held less than $\frac{1}{4}$ acre, 425 less than 2 acres, 440 less than 10 acres and only 1 over 10 acres.

Ascension Island

POPULATION

27. NOTE: Only St. Helenians were included in the Census which therefore *did not* include citizens of other Commonwealth countries or United States citizens.

28. 476 St. Helenians were on Ascension, made up of 428 males and 48 females. If these were added to the total population of St. Helena Island, which *did* include European British subjects, etc, the total population would have been 4981 made up of 2586 males and 2395 females.

29. Of St. Helenians on Ascension 68, i.e. 47 males and 21 females, were under 18 years of age and 408, i.e. 381 males and 27 females, were between 18 and 65.

30. 67 males and 27 females, totalling 94 persons, were married. 3 males were divorced persons. 358 males and 21 females, totalling 379 persons, were not married. 25 males were accompanied by their wives and 41 were unaccompanied.

RELIGION

31. 459 persons were recorded as belonging to the Church of England and 17 as belonging to other denominations.

EMPLOYERS AND OCCUPATIONS

32. Employers were as follows:—

Pan American Airways, of 171 males.

Cable and Wireless Ltd., of 142 males and 2 females, totalling 144 persons.

Ministry of Public Building and Works, of 81 males.

Colonial Government of 4 males and 3 females, totalling 7 persons.

33. 215 persons were recorded as labourers, 57 as craftsmen, 25 as workers in mechanical transport and 9 as technicians. 31 persons were clerks and 18 were agricultural workers. 48 were entered as follows, medical assistants (6), teachers (1), shop assistants (8), communications workers (12), marine workers (18), security forces (3).
