# Your Excellency,

- 1. I have the honour to submit herewith my report on the Census of the inhabitants of St. Helena and the St. Helenian inhabitants of Ascension Island which was taken on the night of Sunday, 31st October, 1976.
- 2. The enumeration districts were identical with the electoral areas as laid down in Statutory Rules and Orders 1967, No. 21.
- 3. I beg to draw attention to the following facts which arise from the Report. The total population of St. Helena Island was found to be 5147, made up of 2514 males and 2633 females. Of these inhabitants some 65 males and 56 females may be regarded as other than St. Helenian. The population of Ascension Island was found to include 719 St. Helenians, made up of 539 males and 180 females. The number of St. Helenians in the Colony on the night of the Census can be taken, therefore, as 5745, made up of 2988 males and 2757 females.
- 4. 74 inhabitants in St. Helena were not at home on Census Night and of those, 20 were travelling or out at work and 54 were sleeping or staying in institutions.
- 5. On the night of Thursday, 31st August 1976, precisely two months before Census Night, the oldest person on the Island was Eva Buckley, aged 103. On the night of the Census the three oldest inhabitants on the Island were Margaret Ann Moyce, aged 93, of Well's Cottage; Arthur Eden Bizaare, aged 87, of Upper Jamestown; and Scott Spencer Constantine, aged 87, of White Gate.
- 6. I have expressed my thanks to the enumerators, tabulators and others without whose willing and able assistance the Report which follows could not have been compiled.

# Analysis of the 1976 Census of St. Helena

#### **GENERAL**

- 1. The Census of 1976 was taken by electoral districts as laid down in 1967 and therefore in some respects it was not possible to make direct comparisons with the Census of 1966.
  - 2. A separate census was taken of St. Helenians on Ascension Island.
- 3. In comparing the forms of schedules used, the few additions made to the 1966 schedules were included mainly for clarification of certain particulars relating to employment and social amenities. The general pattern remained virtually the same.
  - 4. Householders were required to complete a total of three schedules.

## **POPULATION**

- 5. The total population of St. Helena Island was 5147 made up of 2514 males (48.8% of the total) and 2633 females (51.2% of the total), while the St. Helenian population at Ascension Island totalled 719.—539 males and 180 females, 75% and 25% respectively, of the total. The total for both Islands was, therefore, 5866. For comparison with the last census taken in 1966, the total population of St. Helena Island was then 4649 comprising 2233 males (48% of the total) and 2416 females (52% of the total). The total in Ascension Island in 1966 was 476 made up of 428 males (90% of the total) and 48 females (10% of the total), and the total for both Islands was 5125.
  - 6. Density of population was 109.5 persons to the square mile (42.3 to the square Kilometre).
- 7. 3031 persons were single (1925 aged under 16 and 1106 aged 16 and over), 1797 were married, 292 were widowed and 27 were divorced. At Ascension Island 506 persons were single (199 aged under 16 and 307 aged 16 and over), 211 were married, 1 was widowed and 1 was divorced. For both Islands, therefore, 36.2% of the total population were single under age 16, 24.1% were single aged 16 and over, 34.2% were married, 5% were widowed and 0.5% were divorced.
- 8. 37% of total persons were aged under 16. Persons of school age numbered 1260 (24% of total population). Of the male population 242 (9.6%) were aged 16 to 20, 1007 (40.1%) were aged 21 to 59, 167 (6.6%) were aged 60 to 69 and 135 (5.4%) were aged 70 and over. Of the female population 284 (10.8%) were aged 16 to 20, 1045 (39.7%) were aged 21 to 59, 173 (6.6%) were aged 60 to 69 and 169 (6.4%) were aged 70 and over.
- 9. Of the total population in both Islands, males aged 16—17 numbered 129 (2.2%), females numbered 133 (2.3%); males aged 18—20 numbered 183 (3.1%), females numbered 163 (2.8%).

# POPULATION DISTRIBUTION

10. The population was distributed as follows:--

## NATIONALITY AND BIRTHPLACE

- 11. A total of 41 persons were not British born and of these 32 had not become British by marriage or naturalised British. In 1966 only 22 persons were not British born and of these only 10 had not become British by marriage or naturalised British.
- 12. 303 persons (5.8%) included in the Census had been born elsewhere than on St. Helena. This compared with 184 such persons in 1966 and 107 in 1956.

# LITERACY. SICKNESS AND INFIRMITY

- 13. 92 persons aged 16 and over were recorded as unable to read or write. These comprised 2.8% of this section of the population (1.8% of the total population). The comparative percentages for this section of the population in 1966 and 1955 were 2.5% and 4.5%, respectively.
- 14. 83 persons were recorded as sick or infirm of whom 62 were at home and 21 in institutions. Of these it was recorded that the infirmity or sickness prevented 34 persons (27 at home and 7 in institutions) from earning a living. In 1966 93 persons were recorded as sick or infirm (66 were at home and 27 in institutions).

## RELIGION

15. 4471 persons, 86.9% of the population, gave their religion as Church of England. The numbers returned as Baptists (139) remained the same as those of 1966. Salvationists decreased by 27%, from 122 to 96. Jehovah's Witnesses increased by 61%, from 92 to 238. Seventh Day Adventists increased by 31%, from 65 to 80. Roman Catholics increased by 49%, from 19 to 37. 86 persons gave other or no denominations.

#### **OCCUPATIONS**

- 16. 1639 persons (31.8% of the population) were gainfully employed; of these 1242 were males and 397 were females. Those non-gainfully employed, excluding children at school and those of pre-school age, totalled 342 males and 1317 females. 96 males (60 in 1969) and 205 females (89 in 1966) were entered as un-employed; of this number 31 males and 27 females were aged 60 and over, therefore unemployment to age 60 totalled 243, 60% of whom were aged 15—18 years.

- 18. Labourers termed Relief workers in 1966 totalled 111 and labourers termed Part-time Labourers in 1976 totalled 24 (decrease of 87). Relief work was abolished in 1973.
- 19. Of the total working population, Government employed 69% (898 males and 233 females) and Messrs. Solomon and Company (St. Helena) Ltd. being the second largest employer, employed 8% (102 males and 36 females). Self employed persons including employers comprised approximately 5% of this section of the population.
- 20. Employees paid by the day, week or month totalled 1508 (1441 in 1966) and those paid by the job/workers on own account totalled 85 (112 in 1966).

## WAGE EARNERS/DEPENDANTS

21. 88 households had one wage earner with five or more but less than eight dependants, and 17 households had one wage earner to eight or more dependants. 183 households, containing up to 11 persons a household, had no wage earners. Welfare payments plus home allotments received from wage earners working on Ascension Island and from various other sources were apparently excluded from the entries made, particularly with regard to those who appeared to have no visible means of financial support.

## HOUSING ACCOMMODATION

- 22. The number of households, 1157, showed an increase of 91 (8.5%) on the 1966 figure. The household of the Consul for France was not included.
- 23. There were 1147 residential buildings (an increase of 12.9% on the 1966 figure) of which 1141 were dwelling houses. Of the dwelling houses 19 had only one living room, 332 had 3 or less and 1018 had 5 or less. 0.97% of the population lived in one-roomed houses. 65% of the population lived in houses with 4 or 5 living rooms, which compared with 65% living in 3 or 4 roomed houses in 1966 and 65% living in 2 or 3 roomed houses in 1956. The average persons per room for 4—5 roomed houses in 1976 was 1.1 and for all houses 1.1 compared to 1.21 in 1966 and 1.29 in 1956.
- 24. 16.9% of the population had only 1 bedroom, 51% had 2 bedrooms and 24.9% had 3 bedrooms. The average persons per bedroom for a 1 bedroomed house was 2.8, for a 2 bedroomed house 2.3, for a 3 bedroomed house 1.8 and for a 4--5 bedroomed house 1.6 On average for all houses there were 2 bedrooms per house and 2.2 persons per bedroom.
  - 25. 31% of all dwelling houses had outbuildings used for storage and other purposes.

26. The external area was given to 1010 (88%) of the total dwelling houses and of these, 13 (1.3%) had an area of less than 20 sq. yds., 85 (8.4%) had an area of 20-40 sq. yds., and 912 (90.3%) had an area of 41 sq. yds. or more.

# WATER SUPPLY AND BATHING FACILITIES

- 27. 665 residential buildings received a piped water supply (1966: 446) (1956: 424), 283 had a standpipe nearby (1966: 288) (1956: 319), 121 had a tank (1966: 133) (1956: 64). Where entered that dwellings had both piped and tank water available, a piped water supply only was recorded. It is supposed that houses, having only tanks, or standpipes, in most instances did not necessarily have them on the house site but generally situated some distance away. 78 residential buildings were near water supplied by springs.
- 28. 1140 residential buildings had baths, of which 466 were permanent fixtures and 674 were movable. I residential building was only supplied with a shower and 6, apparently, had no bathing facilities available. Where there were no bathing facilities it is supposed that mutual arrangements were made to share those amenities with nearby neighbours.

#### LIGHTING AND SANITATION

- 29. 718 residential buildings had electricity for lighting purposes, 157 had paraffin and 186 had candle. 86 had a combination of all three sources of lighting; in a number of cases, small generating plants were used to provide electricity.
- 30. 538 residential buildings had water closets (1966: 390), 556 had earth closets (1966: 624), 36 had pit latrines and 17 had chemical latrines.

#### GARDENS AND FOOD ANIMALS

- 31. 387 residential buildings had a kitchen garden (1966: 283) (1956: 315), 113 had a food garden (1966: 101) (1956: 152) and 14 had both kitchen and food garden. 633 had no garden (1966: 632) (1956: 531).
- 32. 381 residential buildings had food animals, mainly for home consumption, 57 had food animals for sale and 35 had for both home consumption and sale. 674 had no food animals.

## RESIDENTIAL BUILDINGS

- 33. There were 330 residential buildings in Jamestown (179 in Upper Jamestown), 237 in Longwood (155 in Longwood East, including the dwelling occupied by the Consul for France). 199 in St. Paul's (121 in St. Paul's East), 163 in Half Tree Hollow, 83 in Levelwood, 78 in Sandy Bay and 58 in Blue Hill.
- 34. The population in Jamestown numbered 1516 (average 5 persons per house), Longwood 1090 (average 4.6 persons per house), St. Paul's 869 (average 4.4 persons per house) and Half Tree Hollow 747 (average 4.6 persons per house). The population in Blue Hill, Sandy Bay and Levelwood was between 220 and 367, and the average persons per house was between 3.8 and 4.4.

# HEADS OF HOUSEHOLD

35. 668 heads of household were owner occupier (471 in 1966), 348 rent-paying tenants (520 in 1966) and 141 free tenants (175 in 1966).

# LAND HOLDINGS

- 36. NOTE: Land held by (i) The Crown and (ii) Messrs. Solomon and Co. (St. Helena) Ltd. was not included in the return.
- 37. 329 persons held freehold land, 330 persons held leasehold land and 75 held both free and leasehold land. Total freeholdings was 1645 acres (1432 in 1966) and leaseholdings 328 acres (369 in 1966).
- 38. Total landholders was 734 of whom 596 held less than 2 acres each and 2 held over 50 acres each.
- 39. 208 acres were cultivated, 481 were under flax, 538 were used for grazing and 746 were bush etc. The cultivated land was held among 357 persons of whom 141 held less than  $\frac{1}{4}$  acre. 337 less than 2 acres, 355 less than 5 acres and 2 held over 10 acres.

# Ascension Island

#### **POPULATION**

40. NOTE: Only St. Helenians were included in the Census which therefore did not include citizens of other Commonwealth countries or United States citizens.

- 41. 719 St. Helenians were on Ascension Island, made up of 539 males and 180 females. If these were added to the total population of St. Helena Island, which *did* include European British subjects, etc., the total population would have been 5866 made up of 3053 males and 2866 females.
- 42. Of St. Helenians on Ascension Island 199, i.e. 114 males and 85 females, were under 18 years of age and 520, i.e. 425 males and 95 females, were between 18 and 65.
- 43. 121 males and 90 females, totalling 211 persons, were married. 1 female was a divorced person. 1 male was a widower. 303 males and 4 females, totalling 307 persons, were not married. 89 males were accompanied by their wives and 32 were unaccompanied.

#### RELIGION

44. 660 persons, i.e. 91.8% of the total population, were recorded as belonging to the Church of England and 59 as belonging to other denominations.

## EMPLOYERS AND OCCUPATIONS

45. Employers were as follows:—

Pan American Airways, of 183 males and 7 females, totalling 190 persons. Cable and Wireless Ltd., of 123 males and 9 females, totalling 132 persons. Property Services Agency, of 88 males and 4 females, totalling 92 persons.

Government, of 9 males and 6 females, totalling 15 persons.

Volcano Club, of 10 males.

British Broadcasting Corporation, of 9 males.

Composite Signals Organisations, of 2 males.

South Atlantic Cable Company, of 2 males.

- 46. Employees paid by the day or week totalled 294 and those by the month totalled 157. Only I employee was paid by the job.
- 47. 42 persons (1966: 215) were recorded as labourers, 9 as technicians, 43 as clerks/typists, 7 as medical assistants, 5 as shop assistants and 8 as farm/garden workers. Craftsmen including production process workers etc. totalled 83 and workers in mechanical transport totalled 31. (In 1966 there were 57 craftsmen and 25 workers in mechanical transport.) Apparently in 1966 cooks, barmen, orderlies and others were classified as labourers, which would account, therefore, for the great difference in numbers under that category.
