SUBJECT	Medical, Dentistry and Pharmacy (Amendment) Regulations, 2019	
		Memorandum by: Chairman of the Public Health Committee
ADVICE SOUGHT	1.	Executive Council is asked to consider and advise whether the Medical, Dentistry and Pharmacy (Amendment) Regulations, 2019 (Annex A) should be approved and brought into force on the date of publication.
BACKGROUND & CONSIDERATIONS	2.	The St Helena Health Service is heavily reliant on expatriate practitioner's particularly medical officers, pharmacists, dentists and various nurse cadres.
	3.	The Ordinance for the registration of health practitioners on the Island viz medical doctors, pharmacists, dental nurses, and dentists has been reviewed recently to ensure that practitioners hired to work on St Helena are duly qualified for such roles. The review is also to ensure that practitioners can be recruited from far and wide once they have been certified as qualified. The amended regulations herein support the amended Ordinance provisions.
	4.	The Public Health Committee has reviewed the current Medical, Dentistry and Pharmacy Ordinances and the supporting regulations have been produced with support from the AG's Chambers and the Health Directorate. The amendment to the regulations is as detailed in the attached appendix.
FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS	5.	There are no new expected financial impact beyond the current indemnity coverage arrangements for registered practitioners. The potential liability and risk from registering unsuitably qualified practitioners will be mitigated by the proposed arrangement because of the qualifications checks prior to appointment.
ECONOMIC IMPLICATIONS	6.	The economic implications are minimal and potentially positive as this aligns with increased capability to deliver optimal healthcare on the Island.
