he Festival of Running, an annual event hosted by the St Helena Tourist Office, the National Amateur Sports Association and New Horizons, took place between 2 and 9 November 2019.

The Festival of Running, which launched in 2001, aims to increase the offering of events on St Helena, to promote a healthy lifestyle and to establish St Helena as a unique running destination to the international market.

This year's Festival included a 42km Full Marathon and 21km Half Marathon, 10km and 3km Fun Runs, Jacob's Ladder Challenge, and a Trail Run. Unfortunately, due to unfavourable sea conditions the Triathlon, which was this year due to take place at Rupert's, was cancelled and has been postponed until a later date.















Despite there being no records broken, the Festival saw 162 individuals across all events taking part - a record number in participation this year.

The Festival of Running concluded with a prize presentation held at Rosie's Taste 4 Life.

St Helena Tourism commented:

"We would like to take this opportunity to specifically acknowledge the amazing performances of our Island's youth, who excelled throughout the week's events and especially during the Jacob's Ladder challenge. A special mention to the four participants of the 42km marathon who all crossed the finishing line together, turning an individual sport into a team victory."

SEA RESCUE SPONSORED SWIM

he St Helena Sea Rescue team held a Sponsored Swim from Lemon Valley to Rupert's Beach in aid of the Cancer Support & Awareness Charity on Saturday, 16 November 2019.

The team swam a total distance of approximately 2.2NM. Commenting on the swim, Deputy Sea Rescue Manager, Leeroy Caswell, said:

"The swim itself was very challenging not only because of the distance but also because we were swimming against the current. At certain points of the swim it almost felt like I was going backwards but then I remembered why I was doing this swim and that was all the motivation I needed to complete this challenge. Even though the swim was one of the biggest physical challenges I have done, knowing why I did it makes it worthwhile."

A cheque totalling £1158.90 was presented to Charity Committee Members - Olive Williams and Anel O'Bey - after the swim.







TWO SUPER VESSELS VISIT ST HELENA

St Helena on Friday, 8 November 2019.

The vessel called at the Island en-route from Cape Town. At the time of visiting, the vessel carried 12 passengers on-board, all of whom flew out from St Helena after touring the Island. 17 crew were flown in on the same flight and 16 crew departed with the vessel for Brazil on Sunday, 10 November 2019.

he world's biggest ketch – SY Aquijo – arrived at

The vessel is 86 metres long and would cost approximately 450K (four hundred and fifty thousand pounds) per week to charter!

The super yacht – Katharine – arrived at St Helena on Saturday, 9 November 2019, with approximately 13 crew on-board, having travelled from Cape Verde.

Following a brief visit, the vessel departed for Walvis Bay, Namibia on Sunday, 10 November 2019.

The 61-metre super yacht is owned by an American multi-millionaire, and would cost 328K (three hundred and twenty eight thousand pounds) per week to charter. It is also said that the vessel is named after the owner's daughter.
