



## ASCENSION

**BIOSECURITY ORDINANCE, 2020*****BIOSECURITY (FEES) REGULATIONS, 2020***

Having provided a draft of these Regulations to the Island Council in accordance with section 59(4) of the Biosecurity Ordinance, 2020, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 59(2)(a) the Governor makes the following Regulations:

**Citation**

1. The Regulations may be cited as the Biosecurity (Fees) Regulations, 2020.

**Fees to accompany biosecurity import licences applications**

2. The Schedule makes provision for fees that must accompany an application for a biosecurity import licence under section 10(1) of the Ordinance.

**FEES TO ACCOMPANY BIOSECURITY IMPORT LICENCES APPLICATIONS**

*Fees for the import of live animals*

|   |                          |
|---|--------------------------|
| 1. In respect of an application for a dog or cat                                    |                          |
| (a) from Great Britain, Northern Ireland or the Republic of Ireland                 | £110.00 per animal       |
| (b) from St Helena  | £55.00 per animal        |
| 2. For an application in respect of all other animals (save for prohibited animals) |                          |
| (a) from Great Britain, Northern Ireland or the Republic of Ireland                 | £55 per group of animals |
| (b) from St Helena  | £25 per group of animals |

**EXPLANATORY NOTE**

*(This explanatory note does not form part of the Regulations)*

These Regulations prescribe the fees that must accompany applications for biosecurity import licences under section 10(1) of the Ordinance.

The coming into force of these Regulations in respect of the import of cats, dogs and other live animals has the effect of disapplying the Third Schedule to the Animal (Diseases) Regulations, 1950. Those Regulations are made under the St Helena Animal (Diseases) Ordinance, 1944 and applied to Ascension by the St Helena Law (Application to Ascension) Ordinance, 1988.
