

## The Ten-Step Process for Arrivals

### Step One: Pre-Flight Arrangements - Personal Assessment



Passengers are sent a pre-arrival letter and personal assessment forms to return



### Step Two: Pre-Flight Arrangements - Property Assessment



Passengers return an accommodation assessment form ten days before travel and Proper Officers carry out property assessments



### Step Three: Pre-Arrival Arrangements



Passengers liaise with on-Island contacts to ensure property is ready and stocked up with foods and other supplies to last 14 days



### Step Four: Arrival to St Helena



Passengers arrive and are processed at the Airport wearing face masks and observing physical distancing measures



### Step Five: Briefing by Proper Officers



Passengers are briefed on home quarantine, the legality, key restrictions and other information by a Proper Officer



### Step Ten: Ending Quarantine



Passengers undertake an exit test on day 13 after arrival and, if negative, can end their period of quarantine at 11.59pm on day 14



### Step Nine: 14 Days of Quarantine



Passengers must be in home quarantine for 14 days and must not leave the boundary of their property



### Step Eight: Entering the Property



Passengers arrive at their properties and must place signage and tape provided by Proper Officers



### Step Seven: Transportation to Accommodation



Passengers drive or are transported directly to their pre-approved accommodation.



### Step Six: Testing on Arrival



Passengers are tested using a COVID-19 nasal swab test. This is mandatory for all arrivals, with exceptions
