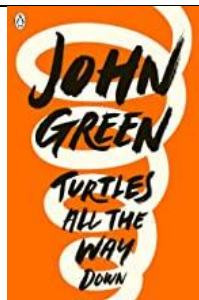
### **Shakespeare's Island by David J. Jeremiah**

Aza's life is filled with complications.

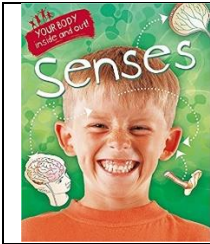

But the chances of a first kiss, and maybe even a first love, could send Aza into a spiral of anxiety.

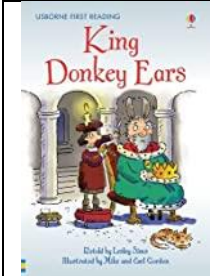
A perfect coming-of-age novel filled with love, mystery and Star Wars fan-fiction.

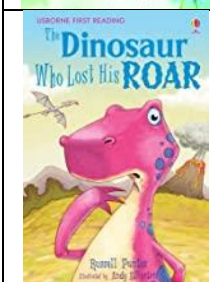
### **King Donkey Ears by Lesley Sims**
