CURRENCY (ASCENSION) ORDINANCE, 2009

PROCLAMATION

In the Name of Her Majesty Elizabeth II, by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and Her other Realms and Territories Queen, Head of the Commonwealth, Defender of the Faith.

By His Excellency Philip Rushbrook Governor of Ascension

WHEREAS it is fitting that coins to commemorate the Platinum Jubilee Photographic Series should be issued under the provisions of section 4(1) of the Currency (Ascension) Ordinance, 2009, which said coins shall be legal tender in Ascension.

AND WHEREAS it is within the province of the Governor to specify the denomination, weight, form and design and composition of coins to be made and issued, by Proclamation and with the approval of the Secretary of State.

NOW THEREFORE, I, the Governor of Ascension, acting in accordance with the provisions of section 4(2) of the Ordinance, and with the approval of the Secretary of State, do hereby order and specify for Ascension the following coins:

Design 1 - Features an official portrait of Queen Elizabeth II by Julian Calder. It was taken in the throne room at Buckingham Palace on the 10th October 2001 and features Her Majesty in the Robe of State, worn at her Coronation in 1953, and the Diamond Diadem Crown, originally made for George IV. On the cushion is the Imperial State Crown, one of the most famous pieces of the Crown Jewels Collection.

The 11 additional coins in this collection feature a range of formal and informal photographs, spanning seven decades of the Queen's extraordinary reign. A number depict the monarch in official regalia worn to important ceremonial events such as the Trooping the Colour Parade and the State Opening of Parliament.

Design 2 – Taken during an official tour of Scotland in the summer of 2010.

Design 3 – Official portrait taken by Baron at Buckingham Palace shortly before the Coronation on 12th March 1953.

Design 4 – Attending the annual Trooping the Colour parade in 1985.

Design 5 – Taken on 21st April 2016 during an official engagement in Berkshire marking her 90th birthday.

Design 6 – Attending Ascot racecourse in Berkshire during the summer of 1990.

Design 7 – In the grounds of Windsor Castle at the annual Order of the Garter ceremony in 2004.

Design 8 – Visiting the Royal Hospital in Chelsea in 1967.

Design 9 – Official portrait taken by Patrick Lichfield on the Balmoral Estate in 1972 to mark the Queen's and Duke of Edinburgh's Silver Wedding Anniversary.

Design 10 – On a state visit to the Danish capital, Copenhagen in the spring of 1957.

Design 11 – Hosting a reception at Buckingham Palace in 2019 to mark the work of the Queen's Trust.

Design 12 – On an official visit to Perthshire in 2017, the year of the Queen's Platinum Wedding Anniversary.

The Obverse design – Portrait of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II by renowned numismatic artist, Joel Iskowitz.
