Standing outside the FBI Headquarters in Washington, DC, Dabney shoots school teacher Anne Berkshire in cold blood before turning the gun on himself.

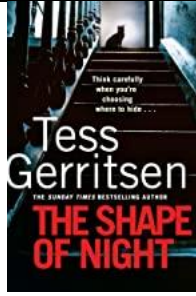

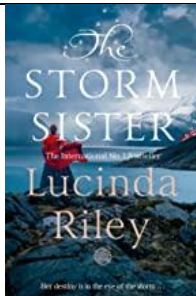
The Shape of Night by Tess Gerritsen

Charlie knows his partner can handle herself, but when she uncovers a past connection that paints a target on her back, the threat of losing her hits Charlie hard. There's nothing he wouldn't do to keep Wyrick safe, but with the clock ticking on a victim they've yet to find, it's only a matter of time before the cold-blooded killer leads them to a deadly end.



The Storm Sister by Lucinda Riley

Following the bestselling *The Seven Sisters*, *The Storm Sister* is the second book in Lucinda Riley's spellbinding series of love and loss, based loosely on the mythology surrounding the famous star constellation. Ally D'Aplièse is about to compete in one of the world's most perilous yacht races, when she hears the news of her adoptive father's sudden, mysterious death. Rushing back to meet her five sisters at their family home, she discovers that her father an elusive billionaire affectionately known to his daughters as Pa Salt has left each of them a tantalising clue to their true heritage. Ally has also recently embarked on a deeply passionate love affair that will change her destiny forever. But with her life now turned upside down, Ally decides to leave the open seas and follow the trail that her father left her, which leads her to the icy beauty of Norway. 1940 - Small Heath, in the heart of Birmingham, is facing the darkest days of the war.

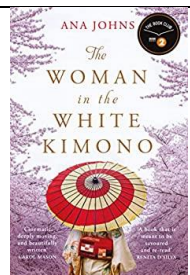
Two very different girls from this tight-knit community join up as ARP wardens to do their bit for the Home Front.

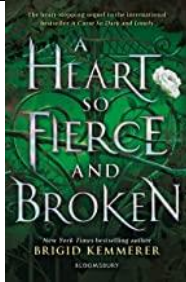


The Best of Sisters by Dilly Court

A Heart so Fierce and Broken by Brigid Kemmerer

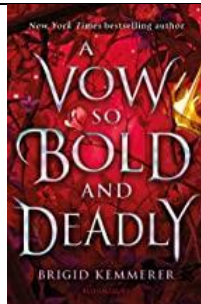

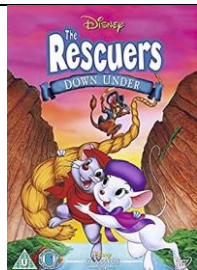
Death in Paradise Series Eight (DVD)
