


#### The Last Widow by Karin Slaughter






### The Lost Daughter by Iris Cole

When Bill Whitely finds Clary beaten in a back alley he offers her sanctuary but a startling discovery spurs her forward into a dangerous undertaking


As Clary navigates a forbidden world, secrets and suspicions are rife, forcing her to flee for her life.




# Girl, Woman, Other by Bernardine Evaristo


# **Five Shots Left by Ben Bridges**


### The Lone Star Ranger by Zane Grey


### **Pandora by Anne Rice**

#### The Moon Sister by Lucinda Riley



But when fate takes a hand, Tiggy must decide whether to stay with her new-found family or return to Kinnaird.




### **Embers by Josephine Greenland**




# Cash by Patrick Carr

This fascinating autobiography of the country music legend recounts the highs and lows, the struggles and hard-won triumphs of his remarkable life.




# Warrior Goddess Wisdom by Heatherash Amara






