AN ORDINANCE

To increase the amounts provided for the services of Ascension Island for the financial year 1 April 2022 to 31 March 2023.

Enacted by the Governor of Ascension after consultation with the Island Council of Ascension.

Short title and commencement

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Ascension Island Supplementary Appropriation Ordinance, 2022, and shall come into force on 14 July 2022.

Development Fund - provision for the financial year 2022-23

2. (1) The Governor may cause to be issued out of the Development Fund and applied during the financial year which commenced on 1st April 2022 a further sum not exceeding £135,000 (One Hundred and Thirty Five Thousand Pounds) which is appropriated for Development Fund expenditure as described in the Schedule.

(2) Insofar as these sums are not expended during the current financial year, any balances may be carried forward to the following financial year or redirected in either financial year to any of the projects specified in the Schedule.

SCHEDULE

Development Fund

Further expenditure in the financial year 1st April 2022 to 31st March 2023. Any unspent balance may be carried forward into the financial year 1st April 2023 to 31st March 2024, or redirected in either financial year to any of the projects specified in the Schedule.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

[This Explanatory Note does not form part of the Ordinance]

This Ordinance, in compliance with s173 of the Constitution, authorises the Government to make supplementary withdrawals from the Development Fund for the financial year 2022-2023 in the amounts set out therein and for the purposes identified in the Schedule. This supplementary appropriation pertains to needs that have arisen for expenditure for purposes for which no amount has previously been appropriated.
