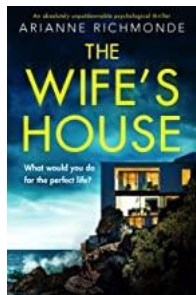

The Wife's House by Arianne Richmond

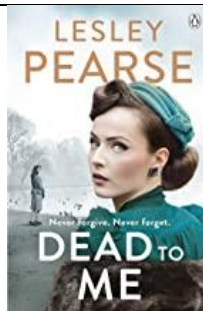

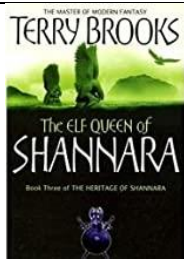

Dead to Me by Lesley Pearse

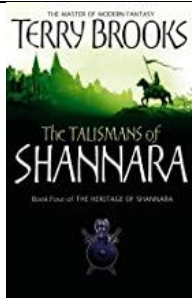

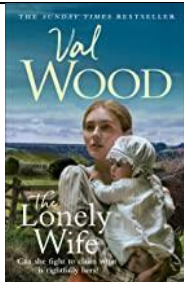
The Elf Queen of Shannara by Terry Brooks

The Talismans of Shannara by Terry Brooks

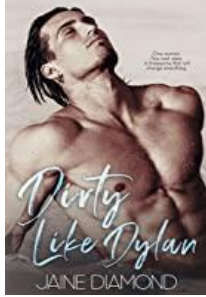

Then she meets rock star Dylan Cope, drummer for the mega-successful rock band Dirty; gorgeous, charming and all-around nice guy.

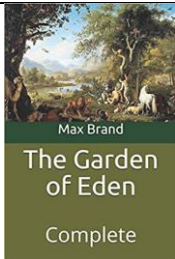
For once, the stars seem to be aligning in Amber's favour.

Dylan's rock star best friend, Ashley Player, is not a nice guy. He's broken, bitter, protective of Dylan and wants Amber gone.

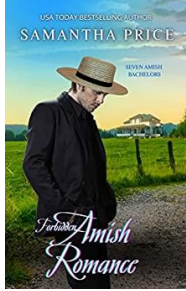
It's almost enough to send her packing.

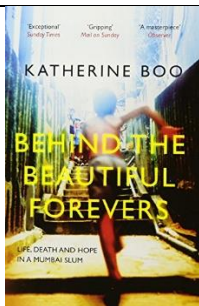
Forbidden Amish Romance by Samantha Price

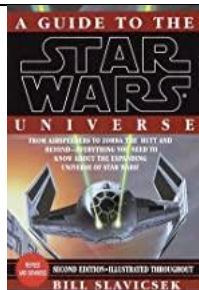
The Captain's Wallflower by Audrey Harrison

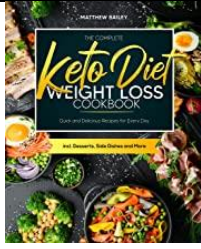
Behind the Beautiful Forevers by Katherine Boo

The film follows the loss of Annie's husband, John, the spark of the calendar idea, their white wine fuelled photoshoot, the ensuing media frenzy as the world wakes up to Yorkshires very own calendar girls and the effects of their new found media fame on their friendships and families.



Gone Girl (DVD)
