

The Millionaire's Wife by Shalini Boland


Everyone has their secrets. But this one could destroy your marriage.

Anna doesn't know who to turn to: her best friend, her parents, her husband. But she knows that her ex-lover is dangerous and she must stop him, before it's too late.




Thirt3en by Steve Cavanagh

Kane knows time is running out - he just needs to get to the conviction without being discovered.




True Betrayals by Nora Roberts



A Shattered Relationship




A Revelation

My Everest Story by Mark Pfitzer and Jack Galvin




Working Fire – The Making of a Fireman by Zac Unger

Here comes trouble!



Why supermarkets don't stock picknicky things like lemonade and chicken wings on the same shelf.


And why maggots are one of the best things about fishing!

But the trouble with maggots is they don't make very good catapult ammunition.




The Sun and the Wind by Mairi Mackinnon




Olivers' Vegetables by Vivian French

Do you like chips? Oliver does. In fact, he won't eat anything else - until he plays a game with his grandpa.


Whatever vegetable Oliver finds in the garden, he must eat. On Monday, he pulls up carrots, on Tuesday, it is spinach.

Tale of a Tadpole by Karen Wallace


Starting out as an egg on a lily pad, follow the life of a new born tadpole as he hides from the dangers of the pond including hungry goldfish and beetles, as he grows up into a frog.

Level 1 books are stories for children just beginning to learn to read. They use short, simple sentences, simple vocabulary, word repetition, and large type. Strong visual clues help children with new words. Lively stories feature characters and topics that are familiar to young children.




Harry Potter and the Philosopher's Stone (DVD)


Laurel and Hardy Berth Marks (DVD)

They just barely make the train and are led to their berth, wreaking havoc amongst the other passengers in their wake. With much difficulty, they undress in their berth. As soon as they're ready for bed, they arrive at Pottsville, their destination, and have to hurry off. Once the train has left the station, they discover that they have left their bass fiddle on board. But the situations aren't important, it's what the boys do with them.



12 Years A Slave (DVD)

Award-winning historical slave-narrative drama directed by Steve McQueen and starring Chiwetel Ejiofor. The film follows the experience of Solomon Northup (Ejiofor), an African-American living with a wife and two children in Saratoga, New York, who is kidnapped and sold into slavery by men claiming to offer him work as a circus musician. Transported by ship to New Orleans, it isn't long before he is given a new name and sold to William Ford (Benedict Cumberbatch), a relatively empathetic slave owner. But confrontations with the cruel and violent overseer John Tibbeats (Paul Dano) lead to Solomon being passed on by Ford to the extremely abusive and alcoholic planter Edwin Epps (Michael Fassbender), who rules his slaves with a whip in one hand and a Bible in the other. Believing the only hope of regaining his freedom is to remain passive for the time being, Solomon ceases fighting against the illegitimacy of his situation until salvation is offered to him by a kindly labourer named Bass (Brad Pitt).



Sahara (DVD)

Master explorer Dirk Pitt takes on the adventure of his life when he embarks on a treasure hunt through some of the most dangerous regions of West Africa. Searching for what locals call "The Ship of Death", a long lost Civil War battleship which protects a secret cargo, Pitt and his wisecracking sidekick Al use their wits and clever heroics to help Doctor Eva Rojas when they realize the ship may be linked to mysterious deaths in the very same area.
