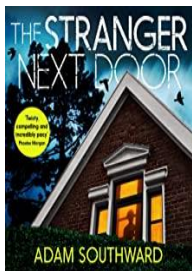

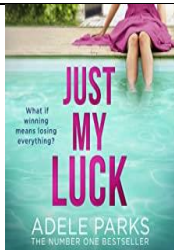


### **The Stranger Next Door by Adam Southward**

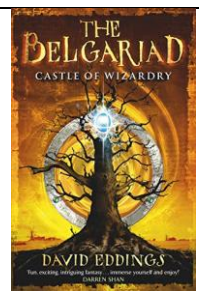

What life will Livvie choose - and what kind of world will be left to her when the fighting ends?



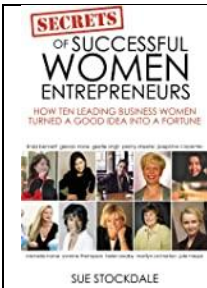
### **The Road Back Home by Jean Brashear**

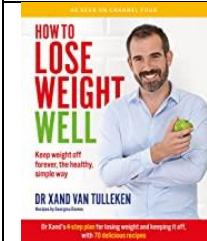
### **Castle of Wizardry by David Eddings**

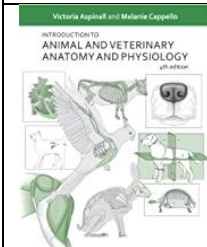
**Secrets of Successful Women Entrepreneurs by Sue Stockdale**

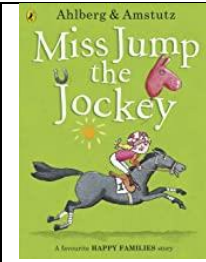
**How To Lose Weight Well by Dr Xand Van Tulleken**

**Introduction to Animal and Veterinary Anatomy and Physiology by Victoria Aspinal**

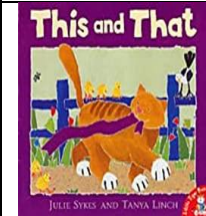

**Miss Jump the Jockey by Ahlberg & Amstutz**

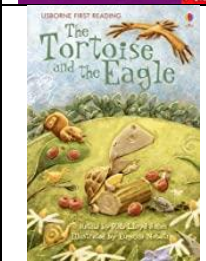
Miss Jump the Jockey is a hilarious picture book by Allan Ahlberg, illustrated by Andre Amstutz.

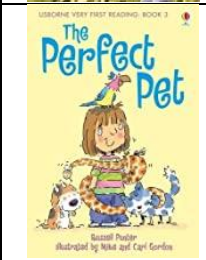
**This and That by Julie Sykes and Tanya Linch**

**Red (DVD)**

Both instalments of the star-studded action comedy starring Bruce Willis and based on D.C. Comics' cult graphic novel. In 'Red' (2010) former CIA top agent Frank Moses (Willis) is now enjoying an idyllic, if rather dull, retirement. But life gets a whole lot more interesting when he narrowly escapes death at the hands of a high-tech assassin. In his subsequent investigations, he discovers that - along with his former Agency colleagues Marvin (John Malkovich), Joe (Morgan Freeman) and Victoria (Helen Mirren) - he appears to have become a prime target of one of the deadliest government conspiracies in history.

	<p><b><u>The Hills Have Eyes (DVD)</u></b>  Wes Craven produces this remake of his 1977 classic of the same name, about the Carters, an idyllic American family travelling through the great American southwest. The family's trip takes a detour into an area closed off from the public, but more importantly from society. An area originally used by the U.S. Government for nuclear testing that was intended to be empty - or so they thought. When the Carters' car breaks down at the old site, they're stranded - or are they? The Carters soon realise that what seemed like a car casually breaking down, might actually be a trap, perpetrated by the inhabitants of the site planning a gruesome massacre.</p>
	<p><b><u>A Place for Annie (DVD)</u></b>  Nurse Susan (Sissy Spacek) fights to keep Annie, her adopted HIV-positive baby, against the claims of the baby's natural mother, a drug-addicted AIDS sufferer. Helping her is an Irish widow (Joan Plowright) who has become Annie's nanny.</p>
