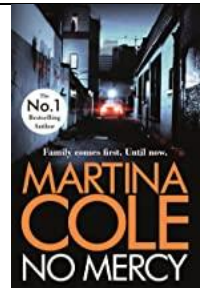


### **The Liar by Steve Cavanagh**

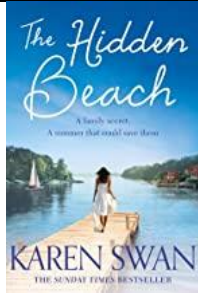
### **No Mercy by Martina Cole**

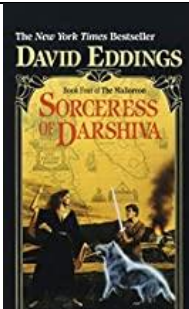


### **The Broken Man by Josephine Cox**

A war that is impossible to win and that they cannot afford to lose.

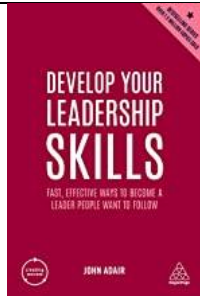


### **Merrily Matched by Cathryn Brown**

Because she's failed at romance in the past, love isn't on her schedule. Neither is the dog she adopts and has no idea how to take care of.

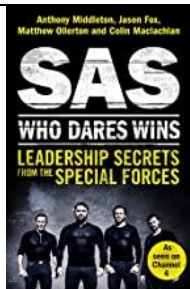

This indispensable guide from leadership guru John Adair, will boost your confidence levels, inspire you and help you on your journey to becoming a leader of excellence.

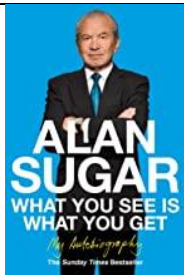

### **SAS Who Dares Wins by Anthony Middleton**

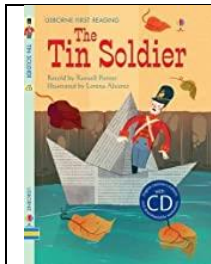

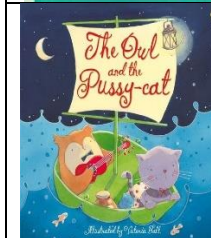
### **What You See is What You Get by Alan Sugar**

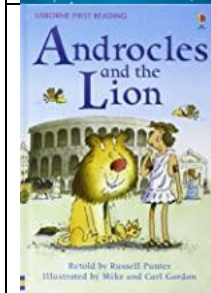
**The Tin Soldier by Russell Punter**

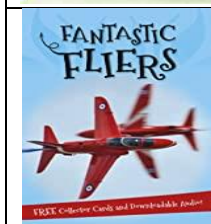
**The Owl and the Pussycat by Edward Lear**

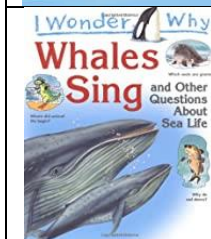
**Androcles and the Lion by Russell Punter**

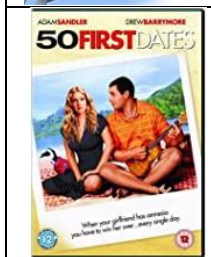
**Fantastic Fliers by Kingfisher**

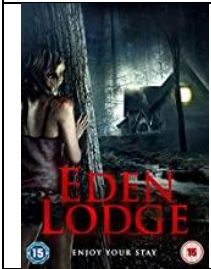
**50 First Dates (DVD)**
