Day 3 - 28.11.22

I must admit, I really did not want to wake up this morning! The tiredness is catching up with me. The team collected biological samples of length, weight, sex and maturity and otolith (a bit of a fish's ear). I did get exposure to identifying the sex and maturity of the fish with the help of the team. Myself and Kirsten were in charge of getting a small sample of the different bait species, this will be used later for stable isotopes (which I have no idea about at this moment in time, but once the work gets done I'll let you know).

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
