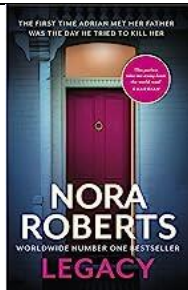

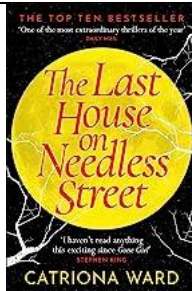

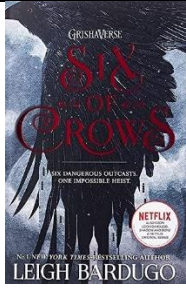

A sharpshooter who can't walk away from a wager.

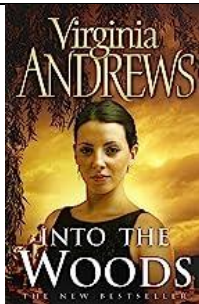
A runaway with a privileged past.

A Heartrender using her magic to survive the slums.

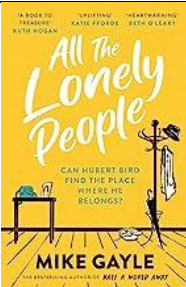
A thief with a gift for unlikely escapes.

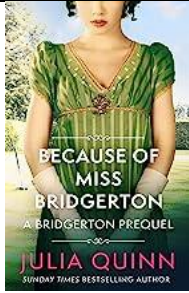
All The Lonely People by Mike Gayle

So when his daughter announces she's coming to visit, Hubert faces a race against time: to make his real life resemble his fake life before he's found out.

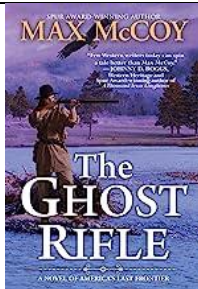

Because of Miss Bridgerton by Julia Quinn

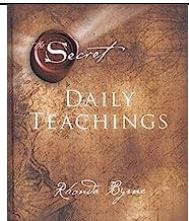

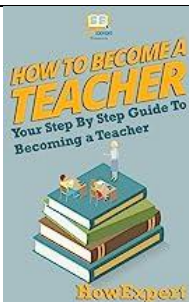
The Ghost Rifle by Max McCoy.

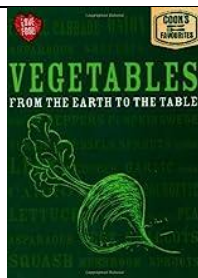


Playing to Win by Karren Brady

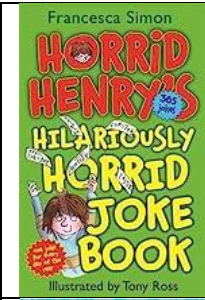

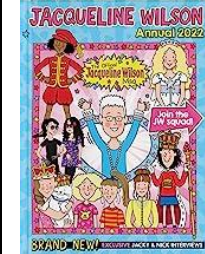

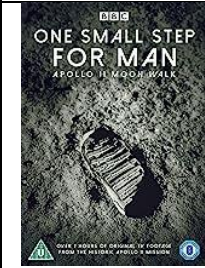
