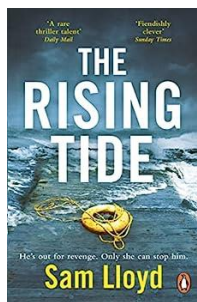

The Second Wife by Rebecca Fleet

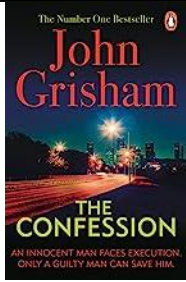
Everyone brings baggage to a new relationship.

But this time, the past could be deadly.



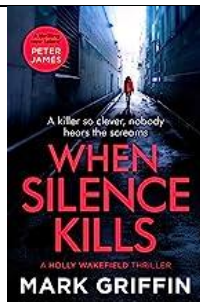
The Confession by John Grisham

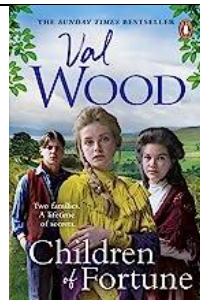
Now, Donte Drumm is four days from execution. But, as Boyette faces his own mortality, he has finally decided to do what's right. He has decided to confess.

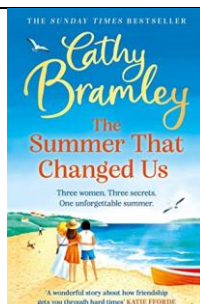


Children of Fortune by Val Wood



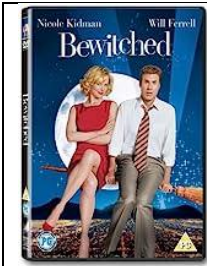


The Summer That Changed Us by Cathy Bramley

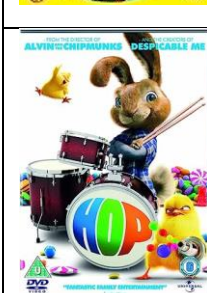
Home Improvement Second Season (DVD)

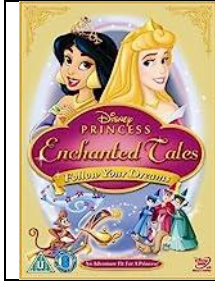
Curious George (DVD)
