Job Purpose

To improve the lives of all within our community and help the island thrive by protecting and saving lives at sea.

Main Duties and Responsibilities

- 1. Carry out directions from the Officer in Charge, ensuring that work is carried out within the standard operating procedures.
- 2. To achieve and maintain a good standard of physical fitness, capability and skills through participation in the appropriate Training Programme.
- 3. Ensuring that standards are maintained in line with the Sea Rescue Service Values and SHG Code of Management.
- 4. Under the direction of the Sea Rescue Service Manager/Deputy Managers and Coxswains, assist Sea Rescue team in maintaining sea rescue facilities, Vessels and equipment, ensuring it is in a state of readiness at all times. This includes assisting the team in inspecting and testing of such equipment, within standard operating procedures.
- 5. Attend training with the Sea Rescue team, building knowledge of seamanship and Search and Rescue techniques.

Special Conditions

- Training in medium risk working conditions i.e. adverse weather conditions, offshore in small vessels, including training at night where there is poor visibility.
- Perform duties requested by the Sea Rescue manager during a Major Incident or Major incident stand-by

- Understand and explain personal responsibilities with regards to health and safety in line with SHG H&S policy.
- Understand and demonstrate correct use of PPE including Lifejacket and PLB
- Be familiar with the layout and equipment of all Sea Rescue Boats.
- Understand and demonstrate basic firefighting procedures (on and offshore)
- Trained in basic Fire safety
- Pass Sea Rescue Service Pre-sea Training and fitness test.
- Have an understanding of Sea Survival as a crew member including deployment of a life raft.

Launch and Recovery

- Under supervision complete a pre-launch and post-recovery check on all sea rescue vessels
- Under supervision describe and demonstrate correct procedures for launching and recovering of all vessels as laid out in the SOPs.

Boat Handling & Seamanship

- Undertake the Sea Rescue crew training and passing all 7 modules
- Understand / demonstrate the principles of coming along side (moving and non-moving platforms).
- Understand / demonstrate the principles of pacing alongside a moving vessel.
- Understand / demonstrate the procedure to follow during a MOB (Man Over Board) situation.
- Understand / demonstrate the principles of Anchoring and Veering down.
- Understand the principles of towing.
- Have the ability to tie basic knots and the use of different types of ropes.
- Understand / demonstrate the correct use of a cleat and stern post.
- Understand / demonstrate the use of the sea anchor.
- Have a basic understanding of Navigation to plot a position on a marine chart by latitude & longitude, range & bearing.
- Understand Coastal tides

- Search & Rescue

- The ability to Helm the vessel under supervision when searching using the following search patterns: creeping line, expanding square search, etc.
- Understand single waypoint navigation on the GPS and correctly interpret the information.
- Have the ability to perform look out duties during a search.
- Have a basic understanding of the Global Maritime Distress Safety System, (GMDSS).

Communications

- Trained in the Sea Rescue service VHF radio operation course.
- Understand the correct use of a Maritime VHF radio



Have a Basics understanding of the Radio Direction finder

- First Aid

- Completion of FREC3 (First Response Emergency Care level 3) course.
- Understand use of basket stretcher and flotation device.
- Understand best practise with regards to casualty care.
- Have the ability to conduct 10 second triage.
