
Book of the Week



Napoleon and Saint Helena Volume 1 by Michel Dancoisne-Martineau

In a series of 12 volumes Napoleon and St Helena, the reef of an empire, Michael Dancoisne-Martineau, director of the French national territories on the island since 1987, describes the ties which bind Napoleon to St Helena with many before unpublished documentation and illustrations.

The importance Napoleon gave to the island of St Helena during his years in power as First Consul and then as Emperor of the French is the unexplored history we discover in this first volume "Napoleon and St Helena 1800 – October 15th 1815. We become acquainted with St Helena's importance during the Dutch occupation of the Cape Province and its strategic significance for the East India Company.

We learn about the details of the visits of the Governor-general of the East Indies and his brother, the Duke of Wellington, and we find out about the first call to St Helena of Admiral Cockburn in 1805 and the full account of his return to the island in 1815 with his famous prisoner, Napoleon.
