It is for this reason that I would like to take this opportunity to garner your support in encouraging the newly appointed Minister for the British Overseas Territories to make it their priority to visit all the

Overseas Territories, especially those that are in receipt of Financial Aid and are highly dependent on ODA. In this regard, I would like to extend an open invitation to the new Minister for OTs to make St Helena the first of their inaugural visits to the OTs.
