



The Stranger in the Mirror by Liv Constantine


A woman with no memory.




No Plan B by Lee Child

Because when the threat is Reacher, there is No Plan B.




Deception by Lesley Pearse

The 6:20 Man by David Baldacci


It's time to catch a killer.

The Party Crasher by Sophie Kinsella



Expect shocking secrets, hilarious mix-ups and an unforgettable romance!




High Street by Anna Jacobs

As Annie gets better acquainted with both, she becomes increasingly confused about her feelings. Can she really be in love And can she risk trusting any man again.




Verity by Colleen Hoover




Liverpool Daisy by Helen Forrester






The Volunteer by Jack Fairweather

In the Summer of 1940, after the Nazi occupation of Poland, an underground operative called Witold Pilecki accepted a mission to uncover the fate of thousands of people being interned at a new concentration camp on the border of the Reich.

His mission was to report on Nazi crimes and raise a secret army to stage an uprising. The name of the detention centre Auschwitz. It was only after arriving at the camp that he started to discover the Nazi's terrifying plans. Over the next two and half years, Witold forged an underground army that smuggled evidence of Nazi atrocities out of Auschwitz. His reports from the camp were to shape the Allies response to the Holocaust yet his story was all but forgotten for decades.

This is the first major account to draw on unpublished family papers, newly released archival documents and exclusive interviews with surviving resistance fighters to show how he brought the fight to the Nazis at the heart of their evil designs. The result is an enthralling story of resistance and heroism against the most horrific circumstances, and one man's attempt to change the course of history.



The Tomb of Napoleon on St Helena by Michel Dancoisne-Martineau

To commemorate the bicentenary of Napoleon's death, and also of his burial on Saint Helena, we have undertaken a review of the causes of his death. We asked Dr Goldcher to summarise the essence of his work – the latest on the subject in order to resolve the confusion among the studies and hypotheses issued to date. It also seemed appropriate, on the occasion of this bicentenary, to devote some time to his burial site. Napoleon had chosen the site himself, in case his body did have to remain on the island, and had pointed it out to General Bertrand. He was to lie there for eight thousand nights before he was eventually repatriated and buried, as he had wished, "on the banks of the Seine".

The valley, which was christened Napoleon's Valley of the Valley of the Tomb, very quickly became, for the Napoleonic legend, a place of remembrance. The property's history reflects the tensions, political friendships and diplomatic and financial interests which followed, but it also owes much to poetic inspiration. The brilliance and splendour of the Les Invalides tomb cannot eclipse the emotion generated by this site, the temporary culmination of the extraordinary destiny of this man who dies aged 51, 8 months and 20 days.




Unravel the Dusk by Elizabeth Lim


