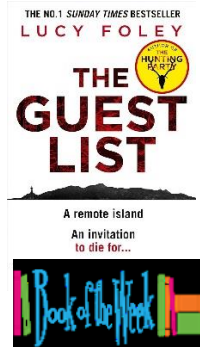

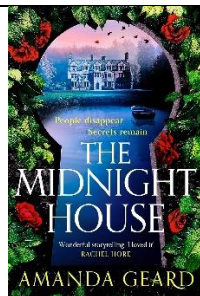

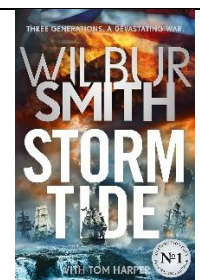


The Midnight House by Amanda Geard

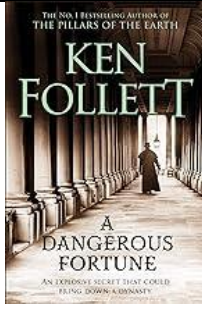

But on the other side of the Atlantic, unbeknownst to Rob, his distant cousins Cal and Aidan Courtney are leading a campaign against the British in a quest for American Independence.

A Tragic Accident

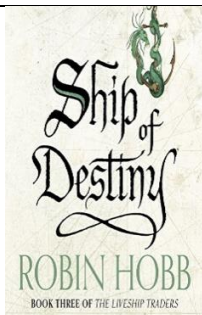
1866: at an exclusive school, a student drowns in a mysterious accident. His death and its aftermath will have repercussions for decades to come.

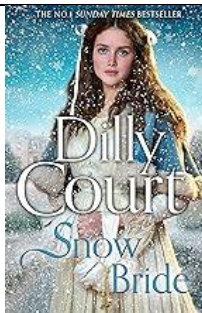
Ship of Destiny by Robin Hobb

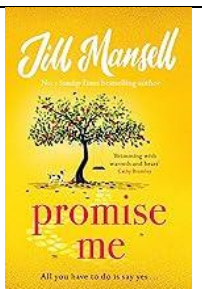
And all the while the waters around the Vivacia are seething with giant serpents, following the liveship as she sails to her destiny.

The colder the cruel grip of winter grows, the more mouths she finds herself having to feed. Can Nancy's good heart and strength bring them all through?



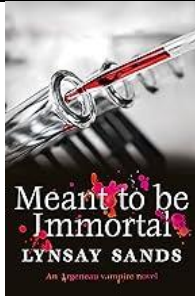
Promise Me by Jill Mansell

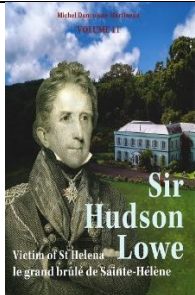


Meant to be Immortal by Lynsay Sands

Sir Hudson Lowe Victim of St Helena by Michel Danscoisne-Martineau

The obsessive and controlling Sir Hudson Lowe, sent by the British to watch over the “enemy of Europe”, exiled on the remotest island in the world, has often been remembered as simply a 2-dimensional “villain” of the St Helena saga. In the latest of his 12-volume series, **Napoleon and St Helena, the end of an Emperor**, the director of the French Domains of St Helena, Michel Danscoisne-Martineau, digs beneath the summary epitaph that history has attached to the former Governor of St Helena.

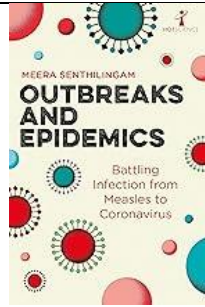
In this volume, Michel Danscoisne attempts to uncover the complexities of the ambitious military man and civil servant by investigating his family background, upbringing, education and career, even attempting to peel back the layers of his psychology. Outbreaks and Epidemics by Meera Senthilingam

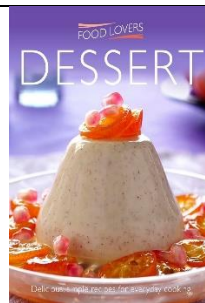
A compelling and disquieting journey through the history and science of epidemics.

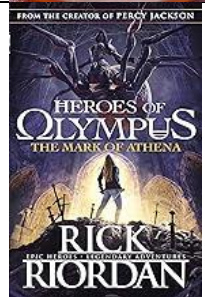

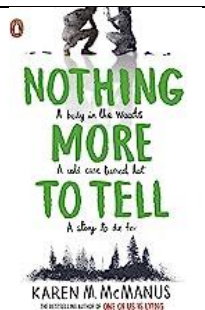


Heroes of Olympus – The Mark of Athena by Rick Riordan

She couldn't shake the feeling that something was about to go terribly wrong. She couldn't risk losing Percy again.



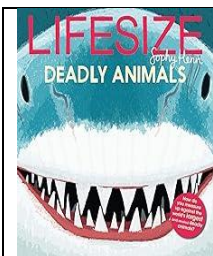
Nothing More To Tell by Karen M McManus

Lifesize Deadly Animals by Sophy Henn

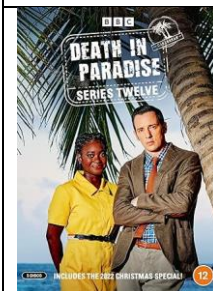
Let's go on a LIFESIZE adventure!
