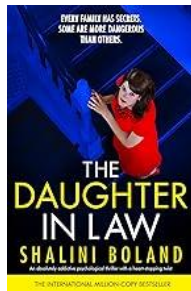

### **The Daughter In Law by Shalini Boland**

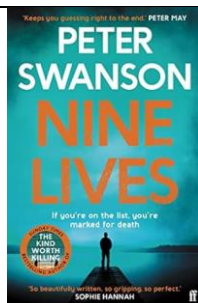
Your new husband has a shocking secret. Would your mother-in-law kill to protect it?

Now I wish I'd never met my handsome, clever husband. Or come to this luxurious house that feels more like a prison.

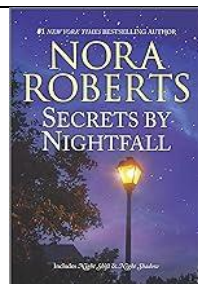


### **Nine Lives by Peter Swanson**

The envelope is unremarkable. There is no return address. It contains a single, folded, sheet of white paper.





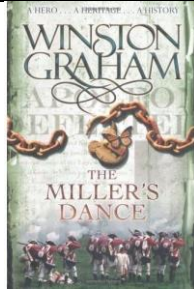


### **Secrets by Nightfall by Nora Roberts**

From the outside, Glenfarach looks like a quaint, sleepy, snow-dusted village, nestled deep in the heart of Cairngorms National Park, but things aren't what they seem. The place is thick with security cameras and there's a strict nine o'clock curfew, because Glenfarach is the final sanctuary for people who've served their sentences but can't be safely released into the general population. Edward's new boss, DI Victoria Montgomery-Porter, insists they head back to Aberdeen before the approaching blizzards shut everything down, but when an ex-cop-turned-gangster is discovered tortured to death in his bungalow, someone needs to take charge.</p>

### **The Miller's Dance by Winston Graham**

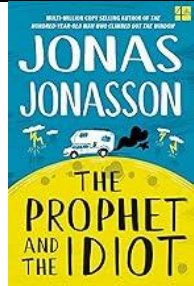

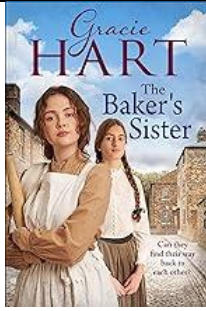

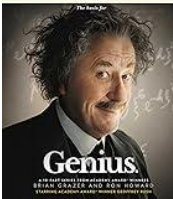


### **The Baker's Sister by Gracie Hart**

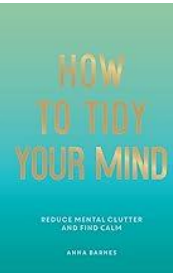
### **Einstein by Walter Isaacson**





