Setting Sail For Adventure

Wavysail Open Adventures has been a frequent visitor to St Helena for several years and, in collaboration with the St Helena Government (SHG), they launched the St Helena Open Oceans Fund last year. This initiative provides grants to enable a Saint or someone connected to the island to participate in a Wavysail trip from Jamestown to Cape Town, fostering local engagement and exposure to global sailing experiences.

Separate from the Open Oceans Fund, Wavysail also offers exclusive sailing experiences for international participants around the world, including the breathtaking South Atlantic Ocean that St Helena calls home. These voyages begin in Cape Town, South Africa, with a small group of just six people per trip. Guided by some of the world's most skilled skippers, this voyage provides hands-on sailing lessons, breathtaking ocean views, and opportunities to witness dolphins and whales in their natural habitat.

In November, St Helena welcomed a new crew to the island, opening the door for them to explore its stunning landscapes.

This voyage is ideal for those seeking

thrilling experiences while embracing a love for history. Participants will be captivated by spectacular scenery, rich cultural heritage, and the chance to sharpen their sailing skills.

Looking ahead, another Open Oceans Fund is set to launch next year, further enhancing the opportunities available for the St Helena community and strengthening the island's ties to the world of sailing.
