




The Housewife's Secret by Anna-Lou Weatherley


The Trial by Rob Rinder

The only thing that's certain is that this is a trial which will push Adam - and the justice system itself - to the limit.




The Lost Treasure of the Templars by James Becker


BETRAYAL

When they discover that Emma had fallen into a dark and seedy world of drugs and online pornography, the father demands retribution.


But his desire for revenge will make enemies of people that even Shelley may not be able to protect them from, and take them into a war from which there may be no escape.




Miss Benson's Beetle by Rachel Joyce

Enid Pretty, in her unlikely pink travel suit, is not the companion Margery had in mind. And yet together they will be drawn into an adventure that will exceed every expectation. They will risk everything, break all the rules, and at the top of a red mountain, discover their best selves.

This is a story that is less about what can be found than the belief it might be found; it is an intoxicating adventure story but it is also about what it means to be a woman and a tender exploration of a friendship that defies all boundaries.



A Spool Of Blue Thread by Anne Tyler

'It was a beautiful, breezy, yellow-and-green afternoon.

This is the way Abby Whitshank always begins the story of how she and Red fell in love that summer's day in 1959. The whole family on the porch, half-listening as their mother tells the same tale they have heard so many times before.

From that porch we spool back through the generations, witnessing the events, secrets and unguarded moments that have come to define the family. From Red's father and mother, newly arrived in Baltimore in the 1920s, to Abby and Red's grandchildren carrying the family legacy boisterously into the twenty-first century four generations of Whitshanks, their lives unfolding in and around the sprawling, lovingly worn Baltimore house that has always been their home.




Fallen Angels by Tara Hyland

Dublin, Ireland and Valencia, Spain 1917.


Peter Cullen has no money and no prospects, but he has talent and the will to succeed. All he needs now is luck.

Nick Gerrity is ready to turn his back on his past and start anew, but his secrets might just catch up with him.


And Aida Gonzales, destitute and alone, discovers an unexpected lifeline in the midst of the carnage of World War I.

Her Errant Earl by Scarlett Scott


An American heiress married for her dowry


A marriage of convenience no more what begins in deception and necessity turns into an attraction neither can deny. Can their newfound passion keep them together forever, or will the truth tear them apart?

The Other Edie Trimmer by Jacqueline Wilson


I seemed to be seeing double. I saw two Edies instead of one -but they weren't the same.'
