Now that the ban on prohibition, on the import of poultry and poultry products originating from South Africa has been lifted, we also recommend there is an immediate review on the importation of day old chicks, with an update provided to the public. We recommend that the ENRP consult with the public as soon as possible to gauge interest in restarting a parent-stock breeding facility and put together options as to the operation of the facility.		This initial recommendation has been completed. There was interest submitted from one person with limited poultry experience and the keeper of less than a dozen chickens for one of the 2 poultry units advertised for parent stock breeding and egg production. However, the submission did not allow the unit to be awarded for either of the two poultry uses. Options are now being developed for consideration by the ENRP Advisory Board with respect to how SHG can further incentivise take up of the units to ensure the capital funding spent to renovate the units provide VFM benefits.	Efforts have been made to engage interest in the units but no one has applied for the unit over the last quarter of 2024-25. A further round of EOIs are to be undertaken in May 2025.	Green

We recommend the Portfolio ensures that the review of the policy relating to the release of Agriculture and Forestry land is completed in a timely manner and furthermore that work currently underway relating to the Options Paper is completed and the new Agricultural Policy (AP) is drafted. The Committee should be updated by the end of July on whether the aim to approve the		This policy is currently under review as it is a 2 fold policy – both for forest land and for agricultural land and buildings to be completed by March 2025. This policy will have to take into account the operational requirements related to high level agricultural land and building provisions included in the new Agriculture Policy (AP). This AP is in progress via an Options Paper for the AP currently being consulted on with the agricultural sector.	This policy remains incomplete whilst progress is achieved with the Agriculture Policy. The Policy Options Paper for the AP has been consulted on with the agriculture sector, has been approved by the ENRP Advisory Board at the end of quarter 4 of 2024-25 to progress to ExCo, but has since been awaiting ExCo approval. Paper has been discussed with Cabinet for progressing to ExCo in May 2025.	Yellow

9. We recommend that provision is made for collecting data in order that this can be published annually, especially from those producers in receipt of subsidies and other support from SHG. Data should be published in a manner that demonstrates how support provided is translated into productivity.	This recommendation will be fully established as part of the AP Action Plan once the AP progresses to this stage of development. New policy/legal requirements are needed to ensure we can secure robust data and metrics for agricultural support and build on the limited data producers are willing to provide for SHG.	Not able to be progressed until sufficient progress achieved with AP.	Red
10. We recommend the Portfolio ensure that policy is developed in a manner that empowers compliance and enforcement by the relevant Portfolio Officers, in relation to the utilisation of land and buildings owned by the Crown. An indicative timescale for this action to be completed should be provided by the end of July 2024.	The new AP will include provisions for improved compliance and enforcement functions for utilisation of land and buildings specifically for agriculture purposes.	New compliance provisions drafted for all of SHG agricultural assets to be considered by AP Working Group for inclusion in the AP and also to be included operationally in the Release of Agriculture and Forest Land Policy.
