



The Holiday by John Nicholl


It was meant to be the perfect getaway.

But then I realise he can't take his eyes off the beautiful woman who's just boarded the plane in front of me. In that moment, everything changes. And nobody is safe.




The Babysitter by Phoebe Morgan

What happened that night? Was Caroline as innocent as she seemed – or was she hiding a secret of her own?




The Switch by Beth O'Leary




So Close by Sylvia Day




Without A Trace by Danielle Steel



Three Act Tragedy by Agatha Christie






dear. When Hattie is faced with an unexpected choice, will she bury her heart on the battlefield forever or find a way to love again?




Eve Witness Titanic by DK



Look Into My Eyes by Lauren Child




