



Final Traitor by Andy McDermott


EVERY OPERATIVE KNOWS THE RULES.


Jordan:

On a quiet Tuesday in St Mary Mead, a group of friends gather for dinner.


A policeman, a clergyman, a solicitor, an author, an artist, and an unassuming lady with a shrewd gaze – Miss Jane Marple.

Never underestimate Miss Marple




An Independent Woman by Anna Jacobs

A community torn apart.






A Virgin for the Desert King by Maisey Yates and Pregnant with Her Royal Boss's Baby by Jackie Ashenden The wild royal she can't resist!

One royally shocking secret!



The fourth book in the scarily awesome Ruby Redfort series, by multi-million-copy bestselling author Lauren Child.


This time Ruby must pit her wits against a seemingly invisible foe. How do you set your sights on catching a light-fingered villain if you can't even see him?
